COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST WILLIAM G. EVANS

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on August 30 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Missouri seeking to enjoin William G. Evans, a Fairway, Kansas resident, from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws. The complaint alleges that Evans defrauded a registered broker-dealer by falsely representing his authority to conduct option transactions on behalf of a bank, providing fraudulent guarantee letters as collateral to satisfy margin requirements and inducing the brokerdealer to pay out funds to a nominee account controlled by Evans. The case has been assigned to the Honorable Joseph Stevens, Jr. (SEC v. William G. Evans, 82-0711-CV W-8, W.D. Missouri). (LR-9753)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

LAWRENCE D. MARKHAM SENTENCED

The Seattle Regional Office announced that on August 23, in Spokane, Washington, Superior Court Judge Donald H. Olson sentenced Lawrence D. Markham to a maximum term of imprisonment of not more than 20 years and ordered restitution to nine investors in total amount of \$118,595. After a 23-day trial, Markham was found guilty on nine counts of fraud in connection with the offer and sale of a security, nine counts of first degree theft, conspiracy to commit fraud in connection with the offer and sale of a security, conspiracy to commit theft in the first degree, and sale of unregistered securities.

Two other defendants, Harold A. Kunz and Phillip M. Stephan of Spokane entered quilty pleas to one count of fraud in connection with the offer and sale of a security, prior to the trial of Markham, and in addition agreed to reimbursement of 150 investors whose investments totaled approximately \$1,800,000. Kunz and Stephan were sentenced for ten years and fined \$50,000 each.

The 24 counts of the Information charged that the defendants, principals of four corporations, had sold investment contracts for the sale and lease back of personal property, primarily vending machines. The defendants operated a Ponzi scheme using new investors' funds to make lease payments to earlier investors, without disclosing that the equipment purchased by the investors either had not been purchased or had not been delivered to the lessees. The related corporations are presently under the jurisdiction of a Federal Bankruptcy Court. (State of Washington v. Lawrence David Markham, Harold Arthur Kunz, and Phillip Michael Stephan, Superior Court of Washington, Spokane County, Information No. 81-1-00356-8 and 81-1-00365-8). (LR-9752)
