**EXCHANGE COMMISSION** 

APPLICATION GRANTED AND ORDER ENTERED AGAINST FREDERIX P. DEVEAU

> The Commission announced that on September 10 Judge Fred Shannon of the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Texas, granted the application of the Commission and entered an Order against Frederix P. DeVeau, reportedly a participant in the Federal Witness Protection Program, to show cause why DeVeau should not be held in civil and criminal contempt and against Irving M. Drobny, a Chicago attorney, to show cause why he should not be held in criminal contempt in connection with DeVeau's attempt to defraud an East Coast chain of health clubs. DeVeau is already a defendant in a pending action, SEC v. Frederix P. DeVeau, et al., SA-82-CA-411, W.D. Tex., which arose from his takeover of Jet Industries, Inc., a Texas manufacturer of electric vehicles. A hearing on the Commission action for civil and criminal contempt has been set for October 4, 1982 at 1:30 p.m. in San Antonio, Texas. (LR-9754)
