## **RULES AND RELATED MATTERS**

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

FINANCIAL STATEMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTERED INVESTMENT COMPANIES

The Commission announced the adoption of final rules which amend the financial statement requirements of registered investment companies contained in Article 6 of Regulation S-X. The amendments to Article 6 are being adopted to (1) eliminate rules which are duplicative of generally accepted accounting principles, (2) effect changes which recognize current industry practices, and (3) integrate and simplify the rules to improve financial reporting. In addition, financial statement requirements for employee stock purchase, savings and similar plans are also being amended and transferred to a separate Article 6A. The rules are effective for companies and plans with fiscal years ended after June 15, 1983, with earlier implementation encouraged. (FRR-8)

## **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

NYSE ACTION AGAINST ROBERT P. VOLPE AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed sanctions imposed by the New York Stock Exchange on Robert P. Volpe of Forest Hills, New York, a member of the Exchange. The Exchange expelled Volpe from membership, and barred him from membership, allied membership, and employment or association in any capacity with a member or member organization.

Both the Exchange and the Commission found that Volpe, a floor broker, executed transactions for his own account on the Exchange floor when he was not authorized to do so; purchased stock worth more than \$252,000 although he knew he could not pay for it; improperly withheld reports of his purchases from Purcell, Graham & Co., Inc. (PG), the firm with which he maintained his account; and, before PG was informed of those purchases, withdrew more than \$100,000 from his PG account when he knew that his withdrawal exceeded the available funds and equity. In addition, Volpe falsified two order tickets in connection with his purchases, improperly obtained commissions from PG on transactions he had executed for his own account, and paid the employee of another member firm to act as his clerk without obtaining required Exchange approval. As a result of his misconduct, PG lost over \$120,000.

In sustaining the sanctions imposed by the Exchange the Commission stated: "Volpe's admitted misconduct was very serious .... [H]e deliberately engaged in a pattern of dishonesty that resulted in PG suffering severe losses ... We do not agree with Volpe that his sanctions should be reduced because no harm was sustained by members of the public. The misconduct in which he engaged is no less serious because a brokerage firm suffered the consequences. In a business that presents so many opportunities for abuse and overreaching, and depends so heavily on the integrity of its participants, Volpe's behavior cannot be countenanced. His actions demonstrate a blatant disregard of the obligation of fair dealing borne by all those in the securities industry, and militate strongly against any grant of leniency."
