# CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND

COMPLAINT NAMES THE EQUILINK CORPORATION

The Commission announced that on December 9 it filed a civil injunctive action in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against The Equilink Corporation of East Rutherford, New Jersey. The Commission, in its complaint, alleges violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws and seeks a Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief.

The Commission alleges that Equilink, as part of a continuing course of violative conduct extending over several years, failed to file various periodic reports in a timely fashion and failed, to the date of the complaint, to file its Annual Report on Form 10-K for its fiscal year ended July 31, 1982, required to have been filed with the Commission by October 29, 1982. The Commission requests that the Court order Equilink to file its delinquent annual report forthwith and that the Court enjoin Equilink from further violations of the reporting provisions of the securities laws.
