SUMMARY OF MEETING:

Mr. Cladouhos, who represents several ATV interests indicated he was interested in trying to get a sense of where Commissioner Moore stood on the ATV issue.

Ms. Weller that the Commissioner was particularly concerned about the deaths and injuries to children under 16 and in the new rider training programs. Ms. Weller told Mr. Cladouhos that the Commissioner has been receiving regular briefings on the talks with industry but is reserving judgment on them until he hears their final position.

Ms. Weller asked if Mr. Cladouhos could provide her with the number of training sites that were currently in use and Mr. Cladouhos indicated he would try to obtain that information for her.

Mr. Cladouhos asked if the Commissioner would be willing to talk to the ATV manufacturers and Ms. Weller indicated she saw no reason why he would not meet with them if they requested a meeting.

Mr. Cladouhos said the industry had made much progress in reducing deaths and injuries--which were down by 50%--and had spent at least \$100 million during the consent decree to achieve those goals.

Mr. Cladouhos told Mr. Weller to feel free to call him if she had any further questions.
