

[Proposed class or classes of copyrighted work(s) to be exempted]= subscription based services that offer DRM-protected streaming video where the provider has only made available players for a limited number of platforms, effectively creating an access control that requires a specific operating system version and/or set of hardware to view purchased material

[Brief summary of the argument(s) in support of the exemption proposed above]= Platform requirements harm consumers in three measurable ways. First, acquiring the necessary platform is often expensive since older hardware isn't fast enough to support streaming video requirements and it's difficult to find one platform which will hit most consumers. Second, platform requirements are primarily used as an anti-competitive tool in the marketplace to support the dominance of one platform over another. Third, there is no reasonable, non-infringing way to replace the accomplish the activity prevented by platform requirements.
