# Recently Revised Personal Income Tax Withholding Schedules

The Franchise Tax Board has revised 15 pages of the Personal Income Tax (PIT) schedules for the Method A Single and Married Persons.

The 2008 PIT withholding schedules have been revised from the information contained in the official 2008 California Employers' Guide. Errors appeared in some withholding ranges provided by the Franchise Tax Board and amount to slight under-withholding for some employees.

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# State Board of Equalization (BOE) Fees

Do you have 10 or more employees who were each employed 160 hours or more in the calendar year? Are you an employer in an industry category that has been identified as having potential for occupational lead poisoning? If so, you may have to register with the Board of Equalization (BOE) and file occupational lead poisoning prevention fee returns. See BOE publication 94, Occupational Lead Poisoning Prevention Fee, for additional information: www.boe.ca.gov/pdf/ pub94.pdf.

Do you have 50 or more employees that were each employed more than 500 hours in the calendar year? If your answer is yes, then you may have to register with BOE and file environmental fee returns. Are you unable to resolve a tax problem with the Internal Revenue Service or a California taxing agency? If you have tried working through the agency's normal resolution channels and you need help unraveling your tax problem, the agency's Taxpayer Advocate may be able to help you.

The advocate ensures your rights are protected and provides an independent, impartial, and confidential review of your unresolved tax problems. 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#### Web Site Offers Child Support Information for Employers

Working in partnership with employers, the Department of Child Support Services (DCSS) helps provide vital financial and medical support to almost two million children and their families. Nearly 65% of child support payments are collected by employers, through wage withholding.

Employers are required to submit all child support wage withholding payments to the California State Disbursement Unit (SDU). The SDU provides a single payment address, streamlined wage assignment processing, and rapid payment to child support recipients.

Employers are encouraged to visit the new Department of Child Support Services (DCSS) Employer Resource Center, a Web site devoted to employer/child support issues.

Go to http://www.childsup.ca.gov/ and click on the Employer tab. At the Employer Resource Center, employers can:

- Open an electronic payment account.
- Make child support wage withholding payments by EFT/EDI or credit card.
- Combine multiple payments into a single transaction.
- Sign up for E-Update, to automatically receive news and tips.
