STATUS INDICATOR

The status indicator is a four-digit code used primarily for personnel accounting and administrative purposes. The information identified by the four digits are as indicated below.

1st digit - Category Code

- 1-Regular, permanent commission
- 2-Regular, temporary commission
- 3-Retired officer recalled to active duty
- *4-Permanent commissioned teaching staff
- *5-Probationary, Permanent commissioned teaching staff

YEAR GROUP

The year group is the promotion year in which an officer, who has had continuous active commissioned service since commissioning and who has not gained or lost numbers or precedence, is originally commissioned in the grade of ensign. The promotion year is 1 July through 30 June of the following year.

SIGNAL NUMBER

Each year at the time a new Register is printed, officers are assigned a new signal number. This number designates their seniority in relation to other active duty officers.

The signal number of officers who are not included on the Active Duty Promotion List will be the same as that of their running mate except it will contain an alphabetical suffix.
