Even though drivers/sales workers and truck drivers experienced the most fatalities, the highest fatality rates were recorded by logging workers and by aircraft pilots and flight engineers. The fatality rate of 92.4 recorded by both occupations was nearly 23 times the fatality rate of 4.1 registered by all workers.

Fishers, structural iron and steel workers, and refuse and recyclable materials collectors also recorded high fatality rates.
