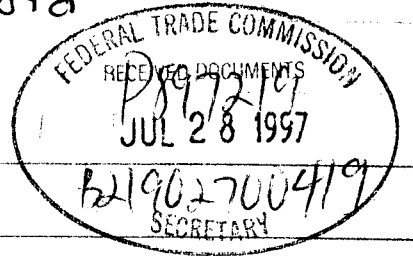

This is a comment regarding the FTC's proposal to change the 50-year-old rule that "all or victvally all" of a product be made domestically before it can be labeled "Made-in-the-U.S.A."

I oppose the current proposed changes.

IF it is indeed necessary to accommo-
date international changes in manufac-
turing and trade, as the FTC claims,
why not simply state what per-
centage of the product is "MADE
IN THE USA?"

The "MADE IN THE USA" label is a
simple, easily understood concept. American
consumers, such as myself, have a funda-
mental right to know the truth; it
should be the role of the F.T.C.

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to protect, not compromise, that right.

In closing, I urge the F.T.C. to
reject these recent proposals.
