General Hunting Regulations
Minnesota state regulations and
refuge-specific regulations will be
enforced. Hunting is allowed only on
refuge units described in this brochure. Each unit offers specific hunting
opportunities during Minnesota state
seasons. You may only hunt species
listed in this brochure.

For authorized hunting, refuge is open two hours before legal shooting time to one hour after legal shooting time.

Non-toxic shot must be used for all species. Possession of toxic shot is illegal.

Some areas have been posted as *No Hunting Zones* to protect buildings, private property or critical habitat areas. Please respect any signed area you encounter in the field.

The possession of alcohol while hunting is prohibited.

Gas or electric boat motors are prohibited on the refuge.

It is unlawful to drive a metal object into a tree or to hunt from a tree in which a metal object has been driven. Screw-in steps are prohibited.

All items, including boats and stands, must be removed at the end of the day. It is unlawful to hunt from a permanent stand.

Furbearers and crows may not be harvested on the refuge at any time.

Single projectiles for small game are prohibited.

The distribution of bait and hunting over bait, including salt licks, mineral blocks or any chemical substance applied to the ground or vegetation is prohibited on National Wildlife Refuge Units. No motorized vehicles are allowed within the hunting units except at designated parking areas.

No hunting on, across or within 50 feet of any road, parking lot or marked trail.

Target shooting is prohibited.

The use or possession of ri□es, pistols or air guns is prohibited on the refuge.

Waterfowl Hunting will be held in accordance with all state and federal hunting regulations and seasons.

Trapping

Various refuge units are open to qualified trappers with a refuge permit.

Getting There

Rapids Lake Unit DNR and Refuge lar

DNR and Refuge land south of the Carver Bluffs development, mostly east of Co. Rd. 45, west of the Minnesota River, and downstream from the Co. Rd. 9 bridge near Jordan.

From the Twin Cities, exit HWY 212 on Co. Rd. 40 to Carver. From the Carver Village Hall near the center of town, continue driving on Co. Rd. 40 south from town 2.2 miles to Co. Rd. 45. Turn left. Drive .8 miles to P1 on your left.

As for P1 above, but continue driving another 1.1 miles south on Co. Rd. 45 to Carver Highlands Drive. Turn left. Drive straight about a half-mile to P2.

P7

Same as P1 and P2, but continue driving south on CR 45 to the south end of the Rapids Lake Unit. The lot is just before the bridge on the left.

> Same as P1, but from the city of Carver continue on CR 40, then turn left into Carver Bluffs Parkway. parking is on left near city soccer fields.

Louisville Swamp/Carver Rapids
State Park and Refuge land between
the railroad and the Minnesota
River, south of the Bryan Rock
Quarry, and north of Duck Lane and
the Valley View Nursing Home.

Exit HWY 169 at 145th St. W. approximately 4.75 miles south of Shakopee. Parking is 1/2 mile in. Drive past the main entrance to the Renaissance Festival, over the next set of railroad tracks, and bear left.

Exit HWY 169 6-1/2 miles south of Shakopee on Bluff Drive. Drive 1/4-mile in to Jordan Ave., and turn right. Park on the right edge of the road, at least 100 yards from the house. You'll need to walk through private property to get to the gate. Please do so quietly.
