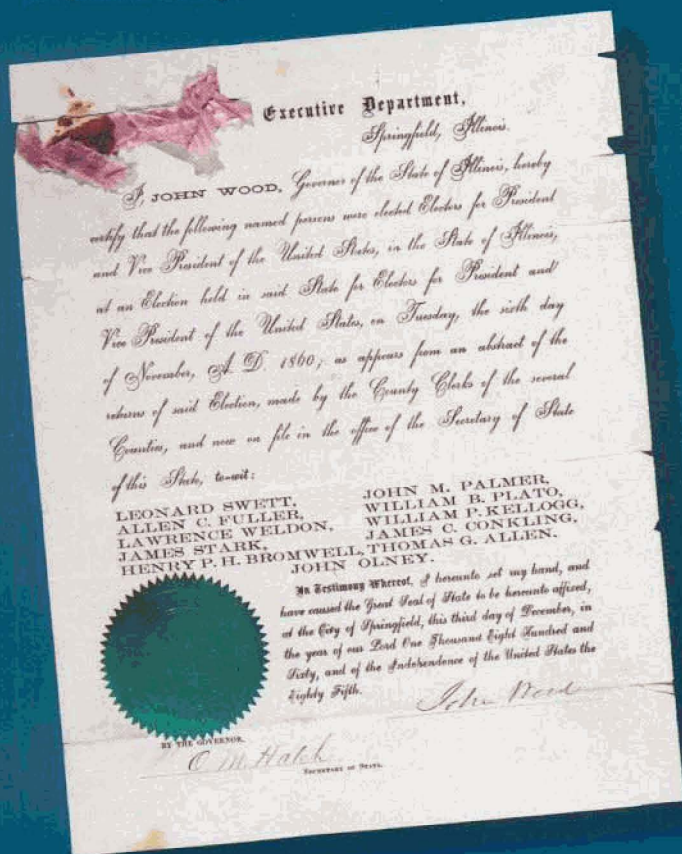

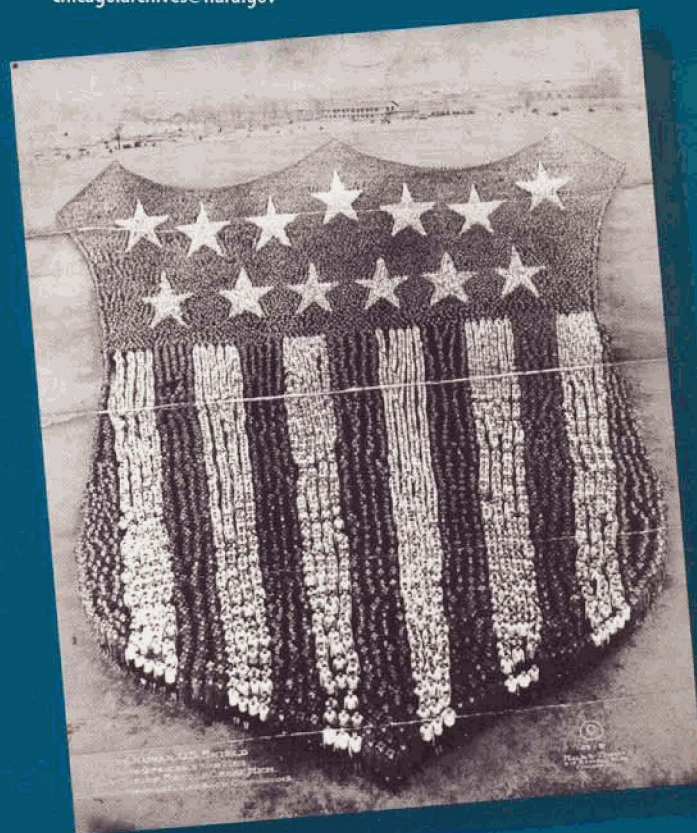

Regional Archives Great Lakes Region

The Regional Archives at NARA's Great Lakes Region is:

- Part of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA), the Federal agency that, by law, preserves and provides access to permanently valuable, noncurrent Federal records with historical, legal, or fiscal value.
- One of 14 NARA facilities where the public has access to Federal archival records.
- A depository and center for research in historical records from Federal agencies and courts in Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, and Wisconsin.
- A center for genealogical research.
- A sponsor of programs that educate the public about archives, history, genealogy, and related subjects.
- A partner with colleges and universities, historical and genealogical societies, museums, and other archives.
- A host for student interns, and school and other groups that want to learn more about archives.
- A national resource in a local setting.

We have:

- More than 78,000 cubic feet of historical records dating from 1800 to the 1990s, among them photographs, maps, and architectural drawings, created or received by nearly 100 Federal agencies, including Federal courts.

We serve:

- Anyone who needs historical information created or received by the Federal Government—historians, genealogists, lawyers, scholars, Government officials, environmentalists, and others.

Our records are:

- Diverse in content, covering the Great Lakes and inland waterways, agriculture, African Americans and Native Americans, the environment, immigration and naturalization, inventions and technology, railroads, the automotive industry, the labor movement, organized crime, the military, domestic conditions during World Wars I and II, sedition and treason, nuclear energy research, and many other subjects.

- Filled with historic names, among them Abraham Lincoln, Vice President Aaron Burr, black nationalist Marcus Garvey, gangster Al Capone, playwright Lorraine Hansberry, and physicist Enrico Fermi.
- Unique evidence of the impact of Federal policies and programs in the Great Lakes region.

If you plan to do research in original records:

- Call before visiting to assure that records are available—773-948-9001.
- Bring identification such as a driver's license, passport, or student ID so that we can issue you a researcher's card.
- Plan on leaving your personal belongings in a locker. Laptop computers are permitted.

Our microfilm holdings are:

- Of genealogical interest—Federal population censuses for all States, 1790–1930; some pre-1900 military service and pension records, and bounty land warrant applications; selected passenger arrival records and indexes for vessels arriving at various U.S. ports; a naturalization index for parts of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, and Wisconsin; and Indian censuses for Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin.
- Of general historical interest—Territorial papers; the Mathew Brady Collection of Civil War photographs; German records captured at the end of World War II; records of U.S. diplomatic missions, the Revolutionary and Civil Wars, the Government's administration of Indian affairs, and the U.S. Supreme Court; records documenting the unexplained loss of Air Force flight #15 in the Bermuda Triangle, 1945; and documentation of the Axis Powers' looting of assets, 1933–45.

If you plan to do microfilm or genealogy research:

- Call ahead to reserve a microfilm reader—773-948-9020.
- Expect to use our self-service microfilm research room with the aid of volunteers and staff.
- Because research is time-consuming, you may need to visit more than once.

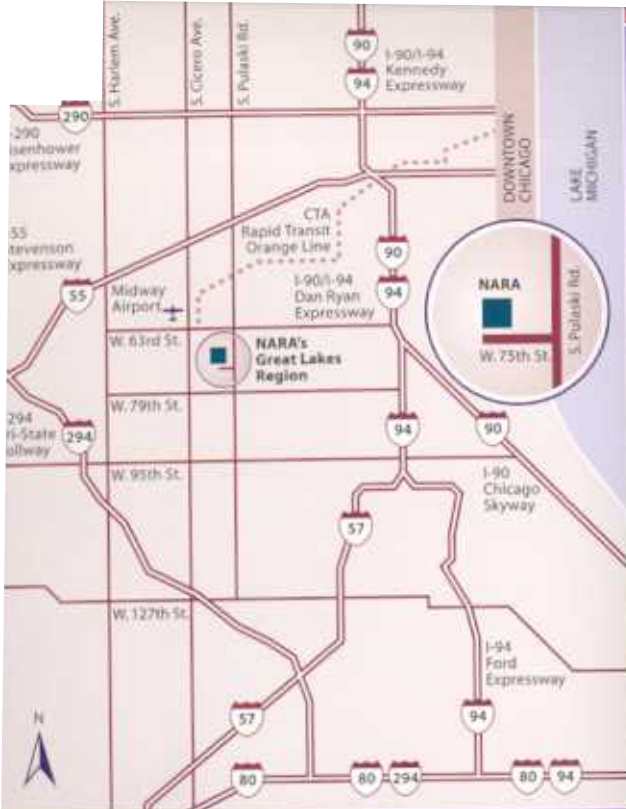

We are located:

- On West 75th Street, 1/8 mile west of South Pulaski Road.
- 15 miles southwest of downtown Chicago, 30 miles southeast of O'Hare International Airport, and 2 miles southeast of Midway Airport.
- 5 miles south of the Pulaski Road exit on the Stevenson Expressway (I-55), 5 miles west of the 79th Street exit on the Dan Ryan Expressway (I-94) and 7 miles north of the Cicero Avenue exit on the Tri-State Tollway (I-294).
- Near the South Pulaski Road and West 75th Street bus stop of the Chicago Transit Authority bus 53A (the South Pulaski Road route). Passengers can transfer from the 53A to other buses, subways, and commuter trains serving the Chicago area.

We appraise, accession, arrange, describe, preserve, and provide access to the essential documentation of the three branches of Government; manage the Presidential Libraries system; and publish the laws, regulations, and Presidential and other public documents. We also administer the Information Security Oversight Office, which manages Federal classification and declassification policies, and the National Historical Publications and Records Commission, which makes grants nationwide to help nonprofit organizations identify, preserve, and provide access to materials that document American history.

Abraham Lincoln, being first day sworn, states on oath that at the former term of this court, Nathan M. Jones, of Peoria county, Illinois, called on affiant to defend a plea said to be pending in this court, and stated to affiant the main facts of the supposed case, being the same of those on which Thomas Delark has, at the present term, obtained a judgment by default; that, on examination, the case then pending was found to be a different one; but said Jones then declared his purpose to defend the suit whenever it should be brought; that during the three first days of the present term affiant was unexpectedly detained away from this court; that on his return he found a letter from said Jones awaiting him, requesting his attendance to the case, and affiant very much believes that said Jones acted in good faith in his endeavor to make due defense, and that default would have been prevented, but for the unexpected and unavoidable absence of the affiant.
