NOTE: If offered admission to the West Point Summer Leaders Seminar, you must notify the Admissions Office of your acceptance by the date indicated in your acceptance letter, or the offer will be withdrawn. Students from all over the nation attend the Summer Leaders Seminar, allowing you to be introduced to a completely different college experience. You will obtain a better understanding of the importance of leadership and how you can help yourself and your country.

There are two sessions of the Summer Leaders Seminar scheduled in 2009. The first session begins Saturday, May 30 and ends Friday, June 5. The second sessions starts on Saturday, June 6 and concludes on Friday, June 12.

About 400 students are selected from applicants nationwide to attend each of the sessions. The cost is \$325, excluding transportation costs to and from West Point. Students are offered admission to

the Summer Leaders Seminar on a rolling basis, so complete your online application as soon as possible. Application deadline is April 1.
