Robert H. Lande is the Venable Professor of Law at the University of Baltimore School of Law, and also is a co-founder and Director of the American Antitrust Institute. He formerly worked at Jones, Day, Reavis and Pogue and at the Federal Trade Commission. He has authored or co-authored more than 60 U.S. and nine foreign publications, including articles in the California Law Review, Journal of Law and Economics, Duke Law Journal, and the Georgetown Law Journal. Seven of his articles have been re-published in books or collections of articles.

Professor Lande has been quoted in the media hundreds of times about antitrust issues, and has discussed antitrust on TV in the United States, France, the United Kingdom and China. He has spoken at national events sponsored by the American Bar Association, Association of American Law Schools, National Association of Attorneys General, American Antitrust Institute, American Economic Association and INCECOPI (Peru). He has testified before the US House of Representatives Judiciary Committee, the US Senate Commerce Committee, and the Antitrust Modernization Commission. He has given competition advice to enforcement officials from four foreign nations. He is a past chair of the Association of American Law Schools Antitrust Section and has held many positions in the ABA Antitrust Section.
