Data Notes

- Data from the CDC HSFS reflects data that states and territories have **documented** without any estimation. As a result, data reported by CDC EHCI may differ from other sources.
- **Normal Hearing:** Includes infants that did not pass the final hearing screening but were found to have normal hearing following an audiological diagnostic evaluation.
- **No Documented Diagnosis:** Group that includes infants that are “In process,” “Died / Parents declined services,” “Non-residents or Moved out of jurisdiction,” and “Unable to contact / Unresponsive / Unknown.”
- **LFU (Loss to Follow-up) / LTD (Loss to Documentation):** Sub group of those reported in “No Documented Diagnosis” and “Total No Services.” Includes infants where families were *Unable to be contacted or Unresponsive and Unknown* cases.
