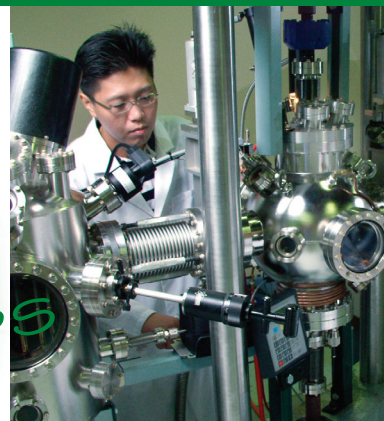


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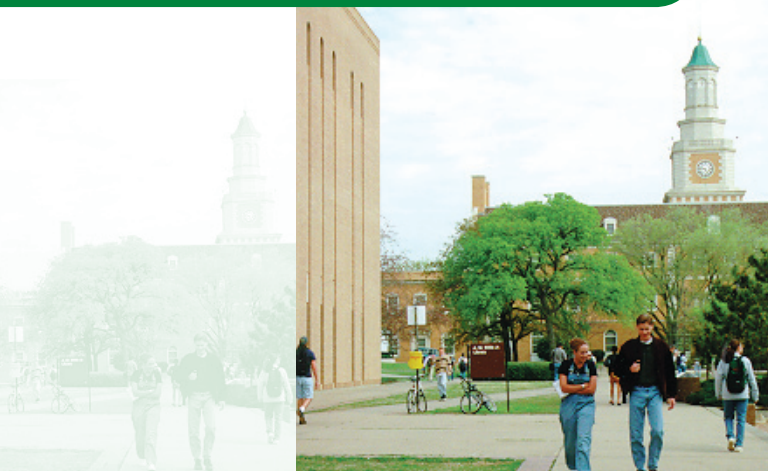

English Language Only

1. Intensive English Language Institute (IELI)

Conditional admission: Available for low TOEFL or GRE scores

1. IELI + UNT Undergraduate
2. IELI + UNT Graduate
3. Graduate Preparation Course (GPC) + UNT Graduate

Direct UNT Admission

1. Undergraduate - with acceptable language proficiency
2. Graduate - with acceptable language proficiency and GRE/GMAT

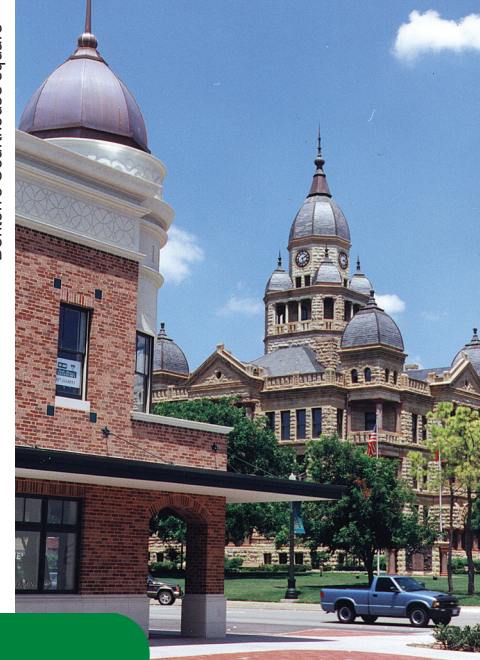

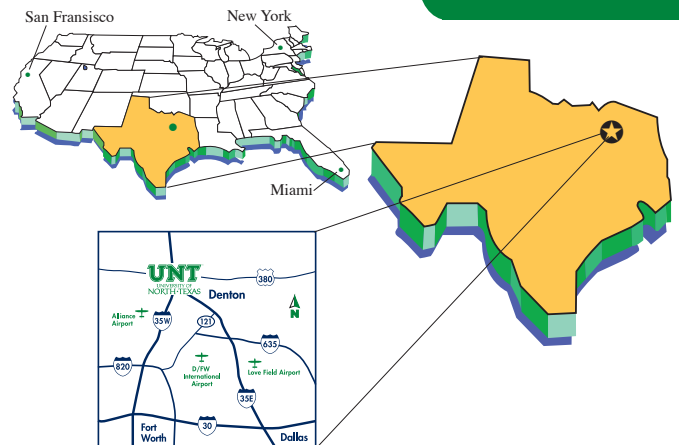
Denton's Courthouse square

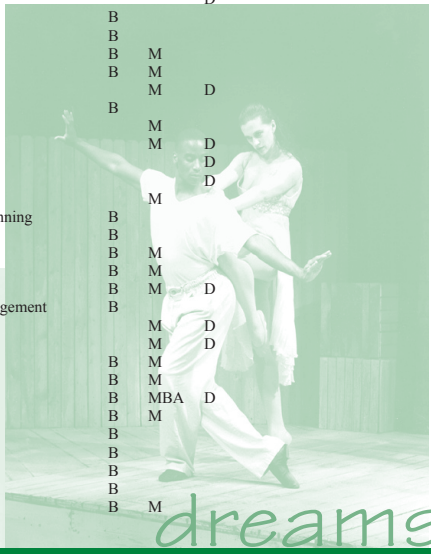

On-campus housing

UNT has 12 residence halls where approximately 6,000 students live. Students can stay in UNT residence halls during school vacations and holidays.

To apply for housing:

After a student receives a UNT ID number from the International Admissions Office, he or she may apply for UNT housing on-line at www.unt.edu/housing. Students receive the ID number immediately after they apply for admission to UNT or IELI.

Advantages of on-campus housing include:

- Close to classroom buildings, dining halls, and campus activities
- Affordable housing/food - approximately \$160 per week for a shared room and 21 meals weekly
- Furnished rooms, computer labs, recreation and fitness rooms, social activities
- Resident Assistants live in each hall to assist and advise students.

Off-campus housing

Many apartments, houses, or rooms are available for students to rent in Denton, Texas.

- Affordable apartments are within walking distance of UNT
- UNT bus routes serve many apartment complexes.
- Prices range widely - from very inexpensive to very costly.
- Electricity, water, telephone/communication service and some furnishings are usually additional costs paid by the student renter.
- Students should allow at least two days to find off-campus housing
- Students should plan to stay in a hotel for a few nights while choosing an apartment.

Financial Concerns

UNT keeps costs as low as possible. UNT provides the quality of a private institution at a lower cost because of state financial assistance.

As non-residents of Texas, international students must pay the non-resident tuition rate. Tuition and fees vary, depending on the number and types of classes. Current tuition and fees are listed at: <http://essc.unt.edu/sauces/tuition.htm>

All UNT and IELI students must have medical/health insurance from the time they arrive at UNT until they graduate or leave UNT. Students are automatically charged for the UNT Health Insurance plan each term or semester. Students may waive this charge by showing that they have other comparable insurance coverage. Details at: www.international.unt.edu

All students must pay all the semester costs (tuition, fees, course fees, medical insurance) at the time of registration.

Employment

- Students may apply for more than 3,500 jobs on campus.
- International students may work 20 hours weekly while school is in session and 40 hours weekly during holidays and breaks.
- UNT's Career Center helps students locate appropriate jobs.
- After registering at UNT, students find on-campus jobs at: ecampusrecruiter.com/unt.
- International students who want to work on campus must get a U.S. Social Security Card in order to be paid. International Advising Office assists students in this process. See details at: <http://www.international.unt.edu/advising/students/employment/ssecurity.htm>

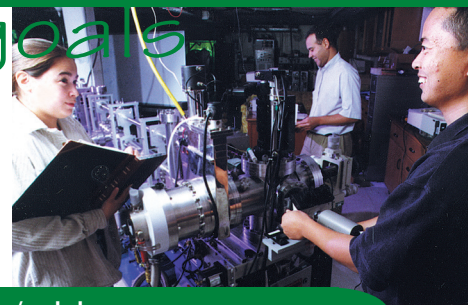

- International students receiving certain assistantships or fellowships may be eligible to pay in-state tuition.

Scholarships

- Apply to UNT by January 1 to receive full consideration for Fall scholarships. Final transcripts may be sent later.
- An international student who is awarded a competitive scholarship of \$1000 (or more) pays the Texas resident tuition rate, a lower rate.

Students permitted by their graduate department to enroll in GPC will also be concurrently enrolled in one graduate course in their major (except during the summer semester).

Successful completion of the non-credit GPC class and a grade of “B” or better in one for-credit graduate course substitutes for the verbal portion of the GRE.

Students may contact International Admissions at international@unt.edu to learn if their department authorizes GPC as a substitute.



Financial requirements

To prepare an I-20 document which allows a student to apply for a student visa, UNT must have written proof of the student’s financial resources.

- Original documents, copies or fax documents are acceptable.

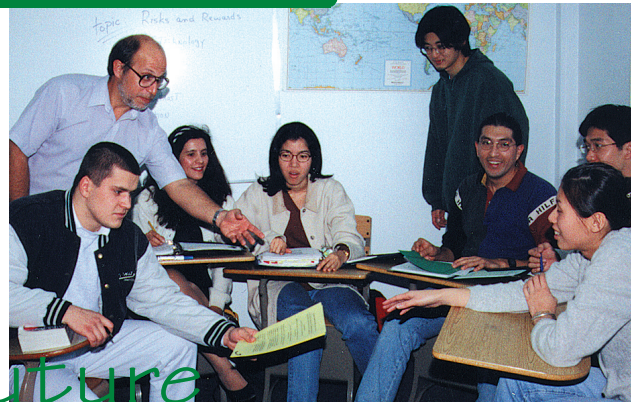

THEA

The State of Texas requires a Texas Higher Education Assessment of all **undergraduate degree** seeking students. The THEA tests reading, writing and mathematics skills, and **MUST** be taken prior to enrolling in classes. Failure of one or more portions of the test may result in course adjustment. The THEA test is taken on-site. It is not used for admissions decisions, but is necessary for preregistration advising.
