#### **Part I: Pre-Orientation Activities**

## A. Register for Orientation

Orientation session 8 (August 22) – for international students outside the United States, who will arrive in the U.S. in August:

Tell them you are an international student attending orientation on Aug. 22 for one day only. You may also pay with a check when you arrive at the orientation, or bill it to your UNT tuition account. The \$48 fee includes lunch and materials.

#### **B. THEA Test**

At UNT, all undergraduate students must demonstrate university-level math, writing, and reading skills before registering for classes. This can be done several ways:

- 1. Take the THEA at UNT (Test schedules are included in this document on page 4)
- 2. Receive an exemption authorized by UNT

- 4. All pertinent correspondence from UNT including award letters for scholarships
- 5. Additional money for vending machines, pizza, UNT apparel, emergencies, etc.
- Personal items: pillow, blanket, personal toiletries, towel, alarm clock, pens/pencils/notebook, umbrella, camera, clothes, and comfortable shoes

#### 4. New International Student Orientation and Document Check-In

**BRING**: Admission letter, passport, I-20 or DS-2019, I-94 & all immigration documents

**F-1 and J-1 visa-holders**: Because your day at UNT will be very busy, F-1 and J-1 visa-holders must read important information for new "F" and "J" students in advance.

     Complete the information review test. Score 80% or higher on the test (open-book test). You may retake the test as required.
  - Go to Document Check-In at the International Advising Office, Kendall Hall, Room 171.
  - Go to Matthews Hall computer lab, Room 307, to register for classes.
  - Pay for classes either online with a credit card or at Eagle Student Service Center, Student Accounting, with cash, check, or credit card.

**Students with other visas or Permanent Pending status**: Proceed directly to Document Check-In at the International Advising Office, Kendall Hall, Room 171.

1. This test is required for new undergraduate (Freshman and Transfer) students.

2. Before you register for UNT classes, you must do one of these things:

1. Take the THEA or a comparable test

2. Receive an exemption

3. Freshmen may take the THEA Test at UNT according to this schedule:

Registration: Register and pay on the test date, at the test site

Location: All tests except July 8 and Aug. 5 - Eagle Student Service Center, Room 255

\*\*July 8 and \*\*August 5 tests only: Business Building, Room 116

Time: 8:30 a.m. (Be on time!)

Allow up to six hours – one hour for registration and five hours for testing

Cost: \$29 (no cash). Pay by personal check or money order made payable to "NES"

or pay by credit card -- Visa or Master Card (no Discover or American Express)

#### Bring:

- 1. Picture identification: Drivers license, student ID, or passport
- 2. Several sharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- 3. You may use a four-function, non-programmable, non-graphing calculator with Square root and percent keys.

## Do NOT Bring:

- 1. Cash for payment
- 2. Cell phones, beepers, alarm watches
- 3. Scientific or graphing calculators
- 4. Backpacks, briefcases
- 5. Food or drinks. There is NO break for snacks or lunch, so eat a good breakfast.

NOTE: No one is allowed to enroll in any college level English or math class until the requirements for the THEA test have been met. (For details, see <a href="https://www.unt.edu/par">www.unt.edu/par</a>)

Students who do not pass one or more sections of the THEA will be placed in a developmental program every semester for the section(s) failed until the student either passes the test or passes the developmental program.
