Much of the report covers the Fall 2001 reporting period. However, some data applies to whole academic or fiscal years. Time periods for individual data items are mentioned in the notes. In order to present the most recent information available, academic or fiscal years data used is not always consistent.

## Institutional Overview, Fall 2001

## Notes:

Headcount. The number of students enrolled in Fall 2001.
Percent Graduate. The percent of the total student headcount accounted for by graduate students. Post-baccalaureate students are not considered graduate students for determining this percentage, even though many may take graduate-level courses and generate master's level semester credit hours.

Percent Black. The percent of the total student headcount accounted for by Black students.

Percent Hispanic. The percent of the total student headcount accounted for by Hispanic students.

Number of Full-time Student Equivalents (FTSE). Semester credit hours generated by students at universities are converted to full-time student equivalents to gauge student utilization of university resources. Fall (or Spring) undergraduate SCHs are divided by 15 SCH to determine FTE undergraduate student. Master's and special professional SCHs are divided by 12 SCH , and doctoral SCH are divided by 9 SCH .

Percent of Full-time Student Equivalents that are Graduate Students. The percent of the total FTSEs accounted for by graduate semester credit hours.

Percent of Undergraduates Transferring from Community and Technical Colleges. The number of undergraduate students who took 30 SCH or more at community or technical colleges in the past six years and who transferred to a university as a percentage of total undergraduate headcount. Post-baccalaureate students are not included in the number of undergraduates.

Percent of Undergraduates Receiving Need-based Financial Aid. The percentage of undergraduates at an institution who are shown in the financial aid database as receiving need-based financial aid.

Headcount (Undergraduate, Graduate, Total). Headcount enrollments are based on certified Fall 2001 enrollment data provided by institutions to the Coordinating Board. Enrollments reflect 12th day class rosters of the Fall semester by the level of the students enrolled. Post-baccalaureate students are included in the undergraduate student count.

## Semester Credit Hours (Undergraduate, Graduate, Total). Public universities in Texas

 award semester credit hours (SCHs) to students successfully completing courses. On the whole, students who are classified as freshmen through seniors receive undergraduate SCHs. Master's, doctoral and special professional students receive graduate SCHS.Full-time Student Equivalents (FTSE) (Undergraduate, Graduate, Total). Semester credit hours generated by students at universities are converted to full-time equivalent students to gauge student utilization of university resources. Fall (or Spring) undergraduate SCHs are divided by 15 SCH to determine FTSE undergraduate student. Master's and special professional SCHs are divided by 12 SCH , and doctoral SCH are divided by 9 SCH .

Average Semester Credit Hours (SCH) per Student. Semester credit hours generated at the undergraduate and graduate levels are divided by respective headcounts to determine the average number of SCHs taken by students. Post-baccalaureate students are included in the undergraduate student number because they have not been admitted to graduate programs; however the semester credit hours they take are allowed to be funded at the master's level. The more post-baccalaureate students an institution has, the greater the effect this discrepancy will have on the average SCH per student by level.

## Per FTE Student:

State Appropriations, Tuition and Fees. The sum of state funds appropriated to an institution and the tuition and fees it received from students is divided by the number of full-time student equivalents to arrive at this figure.

Instructional Expenditures. Expenditures for instruction (primarily faculty salaries) are divided by the FTE student figures to give the relative amounts institutions spend on instruction.

Full-time-Faculty-Equivalents (FTFE). The number of FTE teaching-related faculty (classified as 01 or 02 on the CBM-008) is divided by the FTE student figure to give an indication of the faculty strength of an institution. Generally higher ratios equate to smaller average class sizes.

Percent of Students who are Community or Technical College Transfers. The number of undergraduate students who took 30 SCH or more at community or technical colleges in the past six years and who transferred to a university as a percentage of total undergraduate headcount. Post-baccalaureate students are not included in the number of undergraduates.

Percent of first-time freshmen students who failed one or more portions of the official Texas Academic Skills Program (TASP) examination and were placed in developmental education and who are still enrolled after one academic year. Rates are for FY 2002 and reported by the institutions to the Legislative Budget Board.

First-time Entering Undergraduate Financial Aid Recipients by Amount of Family Contribution as Percent of First-time Entering Undergraduates. First-time entering undergraduates who received financial aid are divided into categories based on the calculated amount their families are determined to be able to contribute. The family contribution is calculated using federal standards based on family income and other factors, such as the number of family members in higher education.

Percent of First-time, Full-time Economically Disadvantaged Students Retained. An economically disadvantaged student (EDS) is a student who has zero expected family contribution in the federal financial aid calculation. For purposes of this retention calculation, an EDS is further defined as a student who entered a Texas public general academic institution of higher education within 12 months of graduation from a public or private high school. To calculate the denominator, take the number of EDSs who first entered in the Fall or Spring of the previous fiscal year (or the Summer of the fiscal year preceding that) on a full-time basis (i.e., taking a minimum of six semester credit hours in the Summer or 12 SCHs in the Fall or Spring). The numerator is the number of those students who are enrolled full-time in the subsequent Fall semester (i.e., the Fall semester of the reporting fiscal year) at the same institution with at least a 2.0 GPA based on a 4.0 scale. The GPA is calculated as of the start of the subsequent Fall semester.

## Notes:

This table presents six-year graduation and persistence rates for undergraduates who entered a public university as first-time, full-time undergraduate students in Fall 1995. The cohort includes students who enrolled in Summer 1995 and continued enrollment in the Fall. Numbers are based on certified enrollment data provided by public institutions to the Coordinating Board. In most cases where data is not shown, the institution in question was an upper-level institution in 1995 and did not admit freshmen.

The rates in this table may understate actual graduation and persistence rates by small amounts. Students are tracked by Social Security Number (SSN). Those whose SSNs have changed are not reported as a match.

Six-Year Graduation Rate from this University. The percentage of undergraduates who entered this university as first-time, full-time undergraduates in Fall 1995 and who graduated from this university within six years (by August 2001). Matching was based on student social security number or student identification number.

Six-year Graduation Rate from another Public University. The percentage of undergraduates who entered this university as first-time, full-time undergraduates in Fall 1995 who were reported to the Coordinating Board as graduates of another public Texas university or health-related institution within six years (by August 2001). Students graduating from independent universities or from out-of-state institutions could not be identified and were not counted.

Six-year Persistence Rate of Students Enrolled at this University. The percentage of undergraduates who entered this university as first-time, full-time undergraduates in Fall 1995 who have not yet graduated but who continued to be enrolled at this university in Fall 2001. Matching was based on student social security number or student identification number.

Six-year Persistence Rate of Students Enrolled at another Texas Public University. The percentage of undergraduates who entered this university as first-time, full-time undergraduates in Fall 1995 who have not yet graduated but who were enrolled at another Texas public university or health-related institution in Fall 2001.

Six-year Composite Graduation and Persistence Rate. The sum of the four previous columns. The composite graduation and persistence rate given here understates the actual six-year graduation and persistence rate by an indeterminate amount because it does not account for students who graduated or continued enrollment at independent or out-of-state institutions or whose social security numbers have changed.

## Other Success Measures

Retention Rate of First-time, Full-time Freshmen Entering Fall 2000. The percentage of Fall 2000 first-time freshmen who took at least 12 hours in Fall 2000 and who returned in Fall 2001. The statistic is based on certified data provided by institutions to the Coordinating Board. First-time students with more than 30 semester credit hours are not classified as freshmen and are not included in the cohort. First-time students who enrolled in the Summer of 2000 and continued in the Fall of 2000 are not included in the
cohort. This differs from the Legislative Budget Board (LBB) statistic which includes firsttime students enrolled in the Summer.

Bachelor's Degrees Awarded to Public Community or Technical College Transfer
Students. For the purposes of this measure, a student was considered a transfer student if he or she had enrolled in 30 semester credit hours or more in the past six years at a public community or technical college. The number column gives the number of transfer students receiving bachelor's degrees. The percent column shows degrees awarded to transfer students as a percentage of all bachelor's degrees awarded. Graduates would have received their degrees between September 2000 through August 2001.

Percent of Baccalaureate Graduates Who Are First Generation College Graduates. Percentage of graduating baccalaureate students whose parents did not graduate from college. Parents are defined only as birth parents, adoptive parents, or legal guardians. This data is from institutions' performance measure reports to the Legislative Budget Board and is collected from questions on the graduation application, or other similar means.

Percent of First-time, Full-time Economically Disadvantaged Students Retained. An economically disadvantaged student (EDS) is a student who has zero expected family contribution in the federal financial aid calculation. For purposes of this retention calculation, an EDS is further defined as a student who entered a Texas public general academic institution of higher education within 12 months of graduation from a public or private high school. To calculate the denominator, take the number of EDSs who first entered in the Fall or Spring of the previous fiscal year (or the Summer of the fiscal year preceding that) on a full-time basis (i.e., taking a minimum of six semester credit hours in the Summer or 12 SCHs in the Fall or Spring). The numerator is the number of those students who are enrolled full-time in the subsequent Fall semester (i.e., the Fall semester of the reporting fiscal year) at the same institution with at least a 2.0 GPA based on a 4.0 scale. The GPA is calculated as of the start of the subsequent Fall semester.

Percent of Semester Credit Hours Completed. This column reflects the degree to which students drop classes. It presents the completed course semester credit hours as a percentage of course semester credit hours (SCH) that students registered for. This figure is calculated from SCHs reported by institutions at the beginning and end of the Fall 2001 semester.

## Teacher Education - ExCET Test Results

## Notes:

ExCET Test Takers and Pass Rate for FY 2002. The State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) administers the ExCET certification for prospective teachers. Candidates traditionally take exams near the end of their preparation program; however, the program must approve their registration for the exams. Assessment data represent candidates' success during the final year of their program ("first-year pass rate" reflects performance during the year the tests are initially taken) as well as the subsequent year ("cumulative pass rate" is based on performance over the two-year period). Such an approach provides an incentive for programs to work with their students if they are not successful in passing on their first attempt. The first-year column shows student performance on ExCET tests taken initially during FY 2002. The cumulative column gives passing rates for tests taken in FY 2001 and in FY 2002 (i.e., from September 2000 to August 2002).

SBEC Accreditation Status. The State Board for Educator Certification accredits institutions' teacher education programs based on their students' results on the ExCET exam. Ratings are determined by the performance of the program's candidates on the assessments required for certification. These assessments evaluate the knowledge and skills (both pedagogy and content) that have been identified by Texas educators as being necessary for beginning educators to possess. Candidates generally take the certification exams near the end of their preparation program; however, the program must approve their registration for the exams.

To be rated "Accredited," a program must achieve a 70 percent first-year pass rate or an 80 percent cumulative pass rate. Each candidate group ("all" candidates, and the ethnic and gender groups) must demonstrate performance at or above either the first-year or cumulative standard.

If the program is under review for two consecutive years, the law compels SBEC's executive director to appoint an administrator with full powers to supervise all aspects of that program. Entities that do not meet standards for three consecutive years become "Not Accredited" and lose the authority to recommend individuals for certification.

The FY 2002 Accreditation Status was issued by SBEC in November 2002.

## Teaching-Related Faculty Statistics and Measures, Fall 2001

## Notes:

Teaching-Related Faculty Headcount by Tenure. Teaching-related faculty are faculty members reported as assigned to:

1. direct instructional activities which include interaction with students related to instruction, preparation for such instruction and evaluation of student performance (category 01), and
2. administrative assignments, which directly supplement the teaching function (category 02).

Faculty members in these two appointment codes are include whether assigned to a class or not; however those with salary reported as zero are excluded. Non-Tenure Faculty are faculty without tenure and not on tenure track including but not limited to adjunct, special, visiting, emeritus, and lecturers. It also may include faculty with tenure or on tenure track from another institution. Teaching Assistants are graduate students who teach or assist a faculty member in teaching a class or lab, but who are not graders.

Teaching-Related Faculty Headcount by Ethnicity. Teaching-related faculty headcount are based on certified Fall 2001 data provided by institutions to the Coordinating Board. The other category includes those faculty whose ethnicity is reported as Asian, American Indian, Pacific islander, Alaskan native or international. The faculty included are those in categories 01 and 02 mentioned above.

Full-time Faculty Equivalents. Full-time-faculty-equivalents (FTFE) as of Fall 2001. FTE faculty are faculty member reported as assigned to categories 01 and 02 as mentioned above and who have a class record on the CBM-004 associated with them. A faculty member's percent of time associated with instruction is reported by his/her institution to the Coordinating Board. Cumulative assignments in instruction and instructional support that add up to one total faculty assignment are considered 1 FTFE.

## Per FTE Faculty:

State Appropriations, Tuition and Fees. The sum of state funds appropriated to an institution and the tuition and fees it received from students is divided by the number of FTE faculty to arrive at this value.

Revenues and expenditures in AFRs are divided by the number of full-time equivalent students (FTE). FTE students are derived by dividing total semester credit hours (SCH) by level for Fall 2000, Spring 2001 and Summer 2001 by the following amounts: undergraduate by 30 SCH ; master's and special professional by 24 SCH; and doctoral SCH by 18.

Revenues and expenditures from all funds, except auxiliary enterprise expenditures or revenues, are included. "Other" expenditures include: public service, academic support, and student services. Grants, gifts, and contracts come from state, federal, private, and local sources. "Other" revenue sources include: Available University Fund, state remissions and exemptions, endowment or investment interest, sales and services, and other. HEAF funds are included in the state appropriation line.

## Institutional Input and Output Comparison

## Notes:

Coordinating Board staff were asked by the LBB in Spring 2000 to create a comparative table similar to one used to evaluate the academic rigor of higher education institutions in another state. This table compares higher education inputs and outputs on the assumption that the academic preparation of students should be taken into account when looking at the key performance measures of retention and graduation rates. Representatives of higher education institutions provided some guidance on improving an earlier version of this table. Even after incorporating the suggestions that were possible, we recognize that this table is limited in its ability to show how retention and graduation rates relate to the academic preparation of students entering a university. The Coordinating Board plans to revise this table in the near future using input from institutions.

Upper-level institutions are excluded from this ranking. Also Texas A\&M International University and The University of Texas-Tyler are omitted as well because they were previously upper-level institutions and did not have Six-Year Graduation Rates to include in the rankings.
(1) Percent of First-time Students who were admitted in Fall 2000 because of the Top $10 \%$ law. To be admitted because of the top $10 \%$ law, a first-time undergraduate student has to graduate in the top $10 \%$ of his or her class at a Texas high school. The numbers in this column do not include out-of-state students. Some institutions reported having no students in this category because they admit students (even top 10\% students) on another basis, such as finishing in the top $25 \%$ of their high school class. The University of Texas-Pan American, Sam Houston State University and the University of Houston-Downtown did not report Top 10\% students for Fall 2000.

## (2) Percent of First -time Entering Undergraduates with \$0 Family Financial

Contribution. This column indicates the first-time entering undergraduate financial aid recipients with no expected family financial contributions to pay college costs as a percentage of all first-time entering undergraduates. It is generally known that economic status and preparation for college are negatively correlated: poorer students tend to be less-prepared academically for college.
(3) Freshman Retention Rate. The percentage of Summer and Fall 2000 first-time freshmen who took at least 12 hours in Fall 1999 and who returned in Fall 2000. Firsttime students with more than 30 semester credit hours are not classified as freshmen and are not included in the cohort.
(4) Six-Year Graduation Rate. The percentage of first-time, full-time undergraduate students entering in fall 1994 who graduated at this or another Texas public university or health-related institution by August 2000. The cohort includes first-time students who enrolled in summer 1994 and continued enrollment in the fall. Numbers are based on certified enrollment data provided by public institutions to the Coordinating Board. Students graduating from independent or out-of-state institutions are not included because they could not be identified.

## II. University Profiles

## Notes to University Profiles

Unless otherwise noted, all figures are derived from certified Fall 2001 data submitted to the Coordinating Board by public higher education institutions.

Total Enrollment and Breakout, Fall 2001. Based on certified Fall 2001 enrollment data. Undergraduate, post-baccalaureate and graduate students are combined to give the total enrollment figure.

Percent of Undergraduates Who are Part-time. The percentage of undergraduate students who took less than 12 semester credit hours of classes in Fall 2001. Postbaccalaureate students are not included.

Percent of Undergraduates Who are Over 24 Years of Age. The percentage of undergraduate students who were over 24 years of age as of September 1, 2001. Postbaccalaureate students are not included.

Average Age of Undergraduates. The average age of students who are classified as undergraduates.

Undergraduates with \$0 Expected Family Contribution. Undergraduates receive financial aid based on the calculated amount their families are determined to be able to contribute. The family contribution is calculated using federal standards based on family income and other factors, such as the number of family members in higher education. The families of undergraduates included in this row are determined to be unable to contribute toward the cost of the students' educations.

This row was produced by matching the Social Security Numbers (SSN) of students reported as undergraduates on the student headcount report for Fall 2001 with SSNs in the financial aid database for Academic Year 2001-2002. Some of these undergraduates did not receive financial aid through the university they attended. These students are concurrently enrolled at another public institution and are receiving their financial aid through that institution rather than their university.

Undergraduates Entering a University Directly from High School. An entering freshman who previously has not attended a college or university and who attended high school during the previous academic year. Includes students enrolled in the Fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior Summer term. Also includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned while attending high school).

First-time Undergraduate Admissions. The number of first-time undergraduate students who applied for admission in Fall 2001, and the percent of those who applied in each gender or ethnic grouping who were admitted. The number of first-time undergraduate students who enrolled in Fall 2001, and the percent of those who applied in each gender or ethnic grouping who actually enrolled at the institution. The number of first-time in higher education undergraduates excludes students who are taking dual or concurrent credit courses while still in high school. The majority of first-time undergraduate students will be freshmen, but some first-time students earn enough dual or advanced placement credits to enter as sophomores.

First-time Undergraduates' Top 10\% Status. The number of offers made to students in the top 10\% of their high school classes; the number of Top 10\% students who enrolled
at the institution; and the percent of the statewide Top 10\% that these enrolled students represent.

Retention of First-time, Full-time Freshmen Entering in Fall 2000. The first row is the number of students who entered this institution in Fall 2000 as first-time, full-time freshmen. The second row is the number of these students who continue to be enrolled at this institution in Fall 2001. The third row is the percentage of students retained (the second row as a percent of the first row). Students enrolled in 12 or more semester credit hours were considered full-time students. First-time students with more than 30 semester credit hours are not classified as freshmen and are not included in the cohort. First-time students who enrolled in the Summer of 2000 and continued in Fall 2000 are not included in the cohort. The freshman retention statistic reported to the Legislative Budget Board (LBB) is calculated in a different way. Its cohort includes students who enrolled in the Summer term and continued in the Fall.

Six-Year Student Graduation and Persistence Rates for First-time, Full-time Undergraduates Entering College in Fall 1995. The first row is the number of students who entered this institution as first-time, full-time freshmen in Fall 1995. The second row is the percentage of this cohort who graduated from this institution within six years (by August 2001) according to Coordinating Board records. The third row is the percentage of the cohort who graduated from another Texas public university or health-related institution within the same six-year period. The fourth row is the percentage of the cohort who have not graduated but who continued to be enrolled at this university in Fall 2001. The fifth row is the percentage of the cohort who have not graduated but who are known to be enrolled at another public university or health-related institution in Fall 2001. The overall graduation and persistence rate is the sum of the previous four rows. This number understates the actual six-year composite graduation and persistence rate by an indeterminate amount because it does not account for students who have graduated from or continued enrollment at independent or out-of-state institutions.

Undergraduate Transfer Students from Public Community or Technical Colleges.
Students who enrolled in 30 semester credit hours or more in the past six years at a public community or technical college.

Bachelor's Degrees Awarded to Public Two-year College Transfer Students. The number of bachelor's degrees awarded in FY 2001 to students who were classified as transfer students.

College Readiness, FY 2000-2001. Undergraduates seeking first-time admission to higher education must take the Texas Academic Skills Program (TASP) or an alternative test for TASP purposes, or be exempted from TASP by their performance on the SAT, ACT or exit level TAAS. This data is for all students enrolling for the first-time at an institution during the academic year, including transfer students. The first row shows the number of students who receive academic exemptions from TASP based on SAT, ACT or exit level TAAS scores and the number who took the TASP test. The third row gives the percent of TASP takers who passed TASP on their initial attempt. The fourth row shows the percent of entering students who required remediation. (Exempted and TASP tested students, less students not passing TASP on their initial attempt.) This data is for the entire Academic Year 2000-2001.

FTE Teaching-Related Faculty, Fall 2001. Full-time-equivalent teaching-related faculty (FTE) as of Fall 2001. FTE faculty are faculty members reported with a salary greater than $\$ 0$ and assigned to:

1. direct instructional activities which include interaction with students related to instruction, preparation for such instruction and evaluation of student performance (category 01), and
2. administrative assignments, which directly supplement the teaching function (category 02).
"Other Faculty" includes faculty without tenure and not on tenure track including but not limited to adjunct, special, visiting, emeritus, and lecturers. It also may include faculty with tenure or on tenure track from another institution. Some other FTE faculty data reported by the CB includes only those faculty assigned to classes.

Total Teaching-Related Faculty Headcount. This row shows the number of faculty members by gender and ethnicity who are reported as faculty in the two categories shown in the preceding item. The following row shows the percentage of persons in each column who are employed less than $50 \%$ of a full-time workload.

Degrees Awarded in FY 2001. This data shows degrees awarded by gender, ethnicity and level and is based on certified graduation data provided by public institutions to the Coordinating Board.

Teacher Test Takers' Pass Rate for FY 2002. Not yet available. The State Board for Educator Certification administers the ExCET certification for prospective teachers. Candidates are eligible to take exams near the end of their preparation program; however, the university program must approve their registration for the exams. "Firstyear pass rate" reflects performance during the year the tests are initially taken; the "cumulative pass rate" is based on performance over the two-year period. Such an approach provides an incentive for programs to work with their students if they are not successful in passing on their first attempt. The first-year row shows student performance on ExCET tests taken initially during FY 2002. The cumulative row gives passing rates for tests taken in FY 2000 and in FY 2002 (i.e., from September 2000 to August 2002). The percentage by gender and ethnicity show the percentage of test takers in each category that passed the ExCET test.

Degrees Awarded by Program and Level in FY 2001. Degree programs are classified according to broad fields of study. Grouping is done using the taxonomy Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) developed by the National Center for Education. Programs were grouped as follows (Numbers in parentheses correspond to major CIP categories):

Carnegie Classification. The Carnegie Classification of Higher Education groups American colleges and universities according to their missions. The Carnegie system aims to cluster institutions with similar programs and purposes. In August 2000 the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching adopted a new classification system. Carnegie classifies institutions primarily on the basis of the highest level of degree awarded. The definitions used for the revised classification are given below.

## Doctorate-granting institutions

Doctoral/Research Universities -- Extensive: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. They award 50 or more doctoral degrees per year across at least 15 disciplines.
Doctoral/Research Universities -- Intensive: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. They award at least ten doctoral degrees per year across three or more disciplines, or at least 20 doctoral degrees per year overall.

## Master's (Comprehensive) Colleges and Universities

Master's (Comprehensive) Colleges and Universities I: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 40 or more master's degrees per year across three or more disciplines.
Master's (Comprehensive) Colleges and Universities II: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 20 or more master's degrees per year.

## Baccalaureate Colleges

Baccalaureate Colleges -- Liberal Arts: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. They award at least half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields. Baccalaureate Colleges -- General: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. They award less than half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.

Headcount. The number of students enrolled in Fall 2001.
Percent Graduate. The percent of the total student headcount accounted for by graduate students. Post-baccalaureate students are not considered graduate students for determining this percentage, even though many may take graduate-level courses and generate master's level semester credit hours.

Percent Black. The percent of the total student headcount accounted for by Black students.

Percent Hispanic. The percent of the total student headcount accounted for by Hispanic students.

Number of Full-time Student Equivalents (FTSE). Semester credit hours generated by students at universities are converted to full-time student equivalents to gauge student utilization of university resources. Fall (or Spring) undergraduate SCHs are divided by 15 SCH to determine FTE undergraduate student. Master's and special professional SCHs are divided by 12 SCH , and doctoral SCH are divided by 9 SCH .

Percent of Full-time Student Equivalents that are Graduate Students. The percent of the total FTSEs accounted for by graduate semester credit hours.

Percent of Undergraduates Transferring from Community and Technical Colleges. The number of undergraduate students who took 30 SCH or more at community or technical colleges in the past six years and who transferred to a university as a percentage of total undergraduate headcount. Post-baccalaureate students are not included in the number of undergraduates.

Percent of Undergraduates Receiving Need-based Financial Aid. The percentage of undergraduates at an institution who are shown in the financial aid database as receiving need-based financial aid.

Enrollments reflect 12th day class rosters of the Fall semester by the level of the students enrolled. Post-baccalaureate students are included in the undergraduate student count.

## Semester Credit Hours (Undergraduate, Graduate, Total). Public universities in Texas

 award semester credit hours (SCHs) to students successfully completing courses. On the whole, students who are classified as freshmen through seniors receive undergraduate SCHs. Master's, doctoral and special professional students receive graduate SCHS.Full-time Student Equivalents (FTSE) (Undergraduate, Graduate, Total). Semester credit hours generated by students at universities are converted to full-time equivalent students to gauge student utilization of university resources. Fall (or Spring) undergraduate SCHs are divided by 15 SCH to determine FTSE undergraduate student. Master's and special professional SCHs are divided by 12 SCH , and doctoral SCH are divided by 9 SCH .

Average Semester Credit Hours (SCH) per Student. Semester credit hours generated at the undergraduate and graduate levels are divided by respective headcounts to determine the average number of SCHs taken by students. Post-baccalaureate students are included in the undergraduate student number because they have not been admitted to graduate programs; however the semester credit hours they take are allowed to be funded at the master's level. The more post-baccalaureate students an institution has, the greater the effect this discrepancy will have on the average SCH per student by level.

## Per FTE Student:

State Appropriations, Tuition and Fees. The sum of state funds appropriated to an institution and the tuition and fees it received from students is divided by the number of full-time student equivalents to arrive at this figure.

Instructional Expenditures. Expenditures for instruction (primarily faculty salaries) are divided by the FTE student figures to give the relative amounts institutions spend on instruction.

Full-time-Faculty-Equivalents (FTFE). The number of FTE teaching-related faculty (classified as 01 or 02 on the CBM-008) is divided by the FTE student figure to give an indication of the faculty strength of an institution. Generally higher ratios equate to smaller average class sizes.

Percent of Students who are Community or Technical College Transfers. The number of undergraduate students who took 30 SCH or more at community or technical colleges in the past six years and who transferred to a university as a percentage of total undergraduate headcount. Post-baccalaureate students are not included in the number of undergraduates.

Percent of first-time freshmen students who failed one or more portions of the official Texas Academic Skills Program (TASP) examination and were placed in developmental education and who are still enrolled after one academic year. Rates are for FY 2002 and reported by the institutions to the Legislative Budget Board.

First-time entering undergraduates who received financial aid are divided into categories based on the calculated amount their families are determined to be able to contribute. The family contribution is calculated using federal standards based on family income and other factors, such as the number of family members in higher education.

Percent of First-time, Full-time Economically Disadvantaged Students Retained. An economically disadvantaged student (EDS) is a student who has zero expected family contribution in the federal financial aid calculation. For purposes of this retention calculation, an EDS is further defined as a student who entered a Texas public general academic institution of higher education within 12 months of graduation from a public or private high school. To calculate the denominator, take the number of EDSs who first entered in the Fall or Spring of the previous fiscal year (or the Summer of the fiscal year preceding that) on a full-time basis (i.e., taking a minimum of six semester credit hours in the Summer or 12 SCHs in the Fall or Spring). The numerator is the number of those students who are enrolled full-time in the subsequent Fall semester (i.e., the Fall semester of the reporting fiscal year) at the same institution with at least a 2.0 GPA based on a 4.0 scale. The GPA is calculated as of the start of the subsequent Fall semester.

## Student Success Measures, Fall 2001 and Academic Year 2001

## Notes:

This table presents six-year graduation and persistence rates for undergraduates who entered a public university as first-time, full-time undergraduate students in Fall 1995. The cohort includes students who enrolled in Summer 1995 and continued enrollment in the Fall. Numbers are based on certified enrollment data provided by public institutions to the Coordinating Board. In most cases where data is not shown, the institution in question was an upper-level institution in 1995 and did not admit freshmen.

The rates in this table may understate actual graduation and persistence rates by small amounts. Students are tracked by Social Security Number (SSN). Those whose SSNs have changed are not reported as a match.

Six-Year Graduation Rate from this University. The percentage of undergraduates who entered this university as first-time, full-time undergraduates in Fall 1995 and who graduated from this university within six years (by August 2001). Matching was based on student social security number or student identification number.

Six-year Graduation Rate from another Public University. The percentage of undergraduates who entered this university as first-time, full-time undergraduates in Fall 1995 who were reported to the Coordinating Board as graduates of another public Texas university or health-related institution within six years (by August 2001). Students graduating from independent universities or from out-of-state institutions could not be identified and were not counted.

Six-year Persistence Rate of Students Enrolled at this University. The percentage of undergraduates who entered this university as first-time, full-time undergraduates in Fall 1995 who have not yet graduated but who continued to be enrolled at this university in Fall 2001. Matching was based on student social security number or student identification number.

Six-year Persistence Rate of Students Enrolled at another Texas Public University. The percentage of undergraduates who entered this university as first-time, full-time undergraduates in Fall 1995 who have not yet graduated but who were enrolled at another Texas public university or health-related institution in Fall 2001.

Six-year Composite Graduation and Persistence Rate. The sum of the four previous columns. The composite graduation and persistence rate given here understates the actual six-year graduation and persistence rate by an indeterminate amount because it does not account for students who graduated or continued enrollment at independent or out-of-state institutions or whose social security numbers have changed.

## Other Success Measures

Retention Rate of First-time, Full-time Freshmen Entering Fall 2000. The percentage of Fall 2000 first-time freshmen who took at least 12 hours in Fall 2000 and who returned in Fall 2001. The statistic is based on certified data provided by institutions to the Coordinating Board. First-time students with more than 30 semester credit hours are not classified as freshmen and are not included in the cohort. First-time students who enrolled in the Summer of 2000 and continued in the Fall of 2000 are not included in the
cohort. This differs from the Legislative Budget Board (LBB) statistic which includes firsttime students enrolled in the Summer.

Bachelor's Degrees Awarded to Public Community or Technical College Transfer
Students. For the purposes of this measure, a student was considered a transfer student if he or she had enrolled in 30 semester credit hours or more in the past six years at a public community or technical college. The number column gives the number of transfer students receiving bachelor's degrees. The percent column shows degrees awarded to transfer students as a percentage of all bachelor's degrees awarded. Graduates would have received their degrees between September 2000 through August 2001.

Percent of Baccalaureate Graduates Who Are First Generation College Graduates. Percentage of graduating baccalaureate students whose parents did not graduate from college. Parents are defined only as birth parents, adoptive parents, or legal guardians. This data is from institutions' performance measure reports to the Legislative Budget Board and is collected from questions on the graduation application, or other similar means.

Percent of First-time, Full-time Economically Disadvantaged Students Retained. An economically disadvantaged student (EDS) is a student who has zero expected family contribution in the federal financial aid calculation. For purposes of this retention calculation, an EDS is further defined as a student who entered a Texas public general academic institution of higher education within 12 months of graduation from a public or private high school. To calculate the denominator, take the number of EDSs who first entered in the Fall or Spring of the previous fiscal year (or the Summer of the fiscal year preceding that) on a full-time basis (i.e., taking a minimum of six semester credit hours in the Summer or 12 SCHs in the Fall or Spring). The numerator is the number of those students who are enrolled full-time in the subsequent Fall semester (i.e., the Fall semester of the reporting fiscal year) at the same institution with at least a 2.0 GPA based on a 4.0 scale. The GPA is calculated as of the start of the subsequent Fall semester.

Percent of Semester Credit Hours Completed. This column reflects the degree to which students drop classes. It presents the completed course semester credit hours as a percentage of course semester credit hours (SCH) that students registered for. This figure is calculated from SCHs reported by institutions at the beginning and end of the Fall 2001 semester.

## Teacher Education - ExCET Test Results

## Notes:

ExCET Test Takers and Pass Rate for FY 2002. The State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) administers the ExCET certification for prospective teachers. Candidates traditionally take exams near the end of their preparation program; however, the program must approve their registration for the exams. Assessment data represent candidates' success during the final year of their program ("first-year pass rate" reflects performance during the year the tests are initially taken) as well as the subsequent year ("cumulative pass rate" is based on performance over the two-year period). Such an approach provides an incentive for programs to work with their students if they are not successful in passing on their first attempt. The first-year column shows student performance on ExCET tests taken initially during FY 2002. The cumulative column gives passing rates for tests taken in FY 2001 and in FY 2002 (i.e., from September 2000 to August 2002).

SBEC Accreditation Status. The State Board for Educator Certification accredits institutions' teacher education programs based on their students' results on the ExCET exam. Ratings are determined by the performance of the program's candidates on the assessments required for certification. These assessments evaluate the knowledge and skills (both pedagogy and content) that have been identified by Texas educators as being necessary for beginning educators to possess. Candidates generally take the certification exams near the end of their preparation program; however, the program must approve their registration for the exams.

To be rated "Accredited," a program must achieve a 70 percent first-year pass rate or an 80 percent cumulative pass rate. Each candidate group ("all" candidates, and the ethnic and gender groups) must demonstrate performance at or above either the first-year or cumulative standard.

If the program is under review for two consecutive years, the law compels SBEC's executive director to appoint an administrator with full powers to supervise all aspects of that program. Entities that do not meet standards for three consecutive years become "Not Accredited" and lose the authority to recommend individuals for certification.

The FY 2002 Accreditation Status was issued by SBEC in November 2002.

## Teaching-Related Faculty Statistics and Measures, Fall 2001

## Notes:

Teaching-Related Faculty Headcount by Tenure. Teaching-related faculty are faculty members reported as assigned to:

1. direct instructional activities which include interaction with students related to instruction, preparation for such instruction and evaluation of student performance (category 01), and
2. administrative assignments, which directly supplement the teaching function (category 02).

Faculty members in these two appointment codes are include whether assigned to a class or not; however those with salary reported as zero are excluded. Non-Tenure Faculty are faculty without tenure and not on tenure track including but not limited to adjunct, special, visiting, emeritus, and lecturers. It also may include faculty with tenure or on tenure track from another institution. Teaching Assistants are graduate students who teach or assist a faculty member in teaching a class or lab, but who are not graders.

Teaching-Related Faculty Headcount by Ethnicity. Teaching-related faculty headcount are based on certified Fall 2001 data provided by institutions to the Coordinating Board. The other category includes those faculty whose ethnicity is reported as Asian, American Indian, Pacific islander, Alaskan native or international. The faculty included are those in categories 01 and 02 mentioned above.

Full-time Faculty Equivalents. Full-time-faculty-equivalents (FTFE) as of Fall 2001. FTE faculty are faculty member reported as assigned to categories 01 and 02 as mentioned above and who have a class record on the CBM-004 associated with them. A faculty member's percent of time associated with instruction is reported by his/her institution to the Coordinating Board. Cumulative assignments in instruction and instructional support that add up to one total faculty assignment are considered 1 FTFE.

## Per FTE Faculty:

State Appropriations, Tuition and Fees. The sum of state funds appropriated to an institution and the tuition and fees it received from students is divided by the number of FTE faculty to arrive at this value.

Instructional Expenditures. Expenditures for instruction (primarily faculty salaries) and instructional support are divided by the FTE faculty figures.

Semester Credit Hours. The total number of Fall 2001 state-funded semester credit hours generated by an institution is divided by the number of FTE faculty.

FTE students are derived by dividing total semester credit hours (SCH) by level for Fall 2000, Spring 2001 and Summer 2001 by the following amounts: undergraduate by 30 SCH ; master's and special professional by 24 SCH; and doctoral SCH by 18.

Revenues and expenditures from all funds, except auxiliary enterprise expenditures or revenues, are included. "Other" expenditures include: public service, academic support, and student services. Grants, gifts, and contracts come from state, federal, private, and local sources. "Other" revenue sources include: Available University Fund, state remissions and exemptions, endowment or investment interest, sales and services, and other. HEAF funds are included in the state appropriation line.

## Institutional Input and Output Comparison

## Notes:

Coordinating Board staff were asked by the LBB in Spring 2000 to create a comparative table similar to one used to evaluate the academic rigor of higher education institutions in another state. This table compares higher education inputs and outputs on the assumption that the academic preparation of students should be taken into account when looking at the key performance measures of retention and graduation rates. Representatives of higher education institutions provided some guidance on improving an earlier version of this table. Even after incorporating the suggestions that were possible, we recognize that this table is limited in its ability to show how retention and graduation rates relate to the academic preparation of students entering a university. The Coordinating Board plans to revise this table in the near future using input from institutions.

Upper-level institutions are excluded from this ranking. Also Texas A\&M International University and The University of Texas-Tyler are omitted as well because they were previously upper-level institutions and did not have Six-Year Graduation Rates to include in the rankings.
(1) Percent of First-time Students who were admitted in Fall 2000 because of the Top $10 \%$ law. To be admitted because of the top $10 \%$ law, a first-time undergraduate student has to graduate in the top $10 \%$ of his or her class at a Texas high school. The numbers in this column do not include out-of-state students. Some institutions reported having no students in this category because they admit students (even top 10\% students) on another basis, such as finishing in the top $25 \%$ of their high school class. The University of Texas-Pan American, Sam Houston State University and the University of Houston-Downtown did not report Top 10\% students for Fall 2000.

## (2) Percent of First -time Entering Undergraduates with \$0 Family Financial

Contribution. This column indicates the first-time entering undergraduate financial aid recipients with no expected family financial contributions to pay college costs as a percentage of all first-time entering undergraduates. It is generally known that economic status and preparation for college are negatively correlated: poorer students tend to be less-prepared academically for college.
(3) Freshman Retention Rate. The percentage of Summer and Fall 2000 first-time freshmen who took at least 12 hours in Fall 1999 and who returned in Fall 2000. Firsttime students with more than 30 semester credit hours are not classified as freshmen and are not included in the cohort.
(4) Six-Year Graduation Rate. The percentage of first-time, full-time undergraduate students entering in fall 1994 who graduated at this or another Texas public university or health-related institution by August 2000. The cohort includes first-time students who enrolled in summer 1994 and continued enrollment in the fall. Numbers are based on certified enrollment data provided by public institutions to the Coordinating Board. Students graduating from independent or out-of-state institutions are not included because they could not be identified.

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## II. University Profiles

## Notes to University Profiles

Unless otherwise noted, all figures are derived from certified Fall 2001 data submitted to the Coordinating Board by public higher education institutions.

Total Enrollment and Breakout, Fall 2001. Based on certified Fall 2001 enrollment data. Undergraduate, post-baccalaureate and graduate students are combined to give the total enrollment figure.

Percent of Undergraduates Who are Part-time. The percentage of undergraduate students who took less than 12 semester credit hours of classes in Fall 2001. Postbaccalaureate students are not included.

Percent of Undergraduates Who are Over 24 Years of Age. The percentage of undergraduate students who were over 24 years of age as of September 1, 2001. Postbaccalaureate students are not included.

Average Age of Undergraduates. The average age of students who are classified as undergraduates.

Undergraduates with \$0 Expected Family Contribution. Undergraduates receive financial aid based on the calculated amount their families are determined to be able to contribute. The family contribution is calculated using federal standards based on family income and other factors, such as the number of family members in higher education. The families of undergraduates included in this row are determined to be unable to contribute toward the cost of the students' educations.

This row was produced by matching the Social Security Numbers (SSN) of students reported as undergraduates on the student headcount report for Fall 2001 with SSNs in the financial aid database for Academic Year 2001-2002. Some of these undergraduates did not receive financial aid through the university they attended. These students are concurrently enrolled at another public institution and are receiving their financial aid through that institution rather than their university.

Undergraduates Entering a University Directly from High School. An entering freshman who previously has not attended a college or university and who attended high school during the previous academic year. Includes students enrolled in the Fall term who attended college for the first time in the prior Summer term. Also includes students who entered with advanced standing (college credits earned while attending high school).

First-time Undergraduate Admissions. The number of first-time undergraduate students who applied for admission in Fall 2001, and the percent of those who applied in each gender or ethnic grouping who were admitted. The number of first-time undergraduate students who enrolled in Fall 2001, and the percent of those who applied in each gender or ethnic grouping who actually enrolled at the institution. The number of first-time in higher education undergraduates excludes students who are taking dual or concurrent credit courses while still in high school. The majority of first-time undergraduate students will be freshmen, but some first-time students earn enough dual or advanced placement credits to enter as sophomores.

First-time Undergraduates' Top 10\% Status. The number of offers made to students in the top 10\% of their high school classes; the number of Top 10\% students who enrolled
at the institution; and the percent of the statewide Top 10\% that these enrolled students represent.

Retention of First-time, Full-time Freshmen Entering in Fall 2000. The first row is the number of students who entered this institution in Fall 2000 as first-time, full-time freshmen. The second row is the number of these students who continue to be enrolled at this institution in Fall 2001. The third row is the percentage of students retained (the second row as a percent of the first row). Students enrolled in 12 or more semester credit hours were considered full-time students. First-time students with more than 30 semester credit hours are not classified as freshmen and are not included in the cohort. First-time students who enrolled in the Summer of 2000 and continued in Fall 2000 are not included in the cohort. The freshman retention statistic reported to the Legislative Budget Board (LBB) is calculated in a different way. Its cohort includes students who enrolled in the Summer term and continued in the Fall.

Six-Year Student Graduation and Persistence Rates for First-time, Full-time Undergraduates Entering College in Fall 1995. The first row is the number of students who entered this institution as first-time, full-time freshmen in Fall 1995. The second row is the percentage of this cohort who graduated from this institution within six years (by August 2001) according to Coordinating Board records. The third row is the percentage of the cohort who graduated from another Texas public university or health-related institution within the same six-year period. The fourth row is the percentage of the cohort who have not graduated but who continued to be enrolled at this university in Fall 2001. The fifth row is the percentage of the cohort who have not graduated but who are known to be enrolled at another public university or health-related institution in Fall 2001. The overall graduation and persistence rate is the sum of the previous four rows. This number understates the actual six-year composite graduation and persistence rate by an indeterminate amount because it does not account for students who have graduated from or continued enrollment at independent or out-of-state institutions.

Undergraduate Transfer Students from Public Community or Technical Colleges.
Students who enrolled in 30 semester credit hours or more in the past six years at a public community or technical college.

Bachelor's Degrees Awarded to Public Two-year College Transfer Students. The number of bachelor's degrees awarded in FY 2001 to students who were classified as transfer students.

College Readiness, FY 2000-2001. Undergraduates seeking first-time admission to higher education must take the Texas Academic Skills Program (TASP) or an alternative test for TASP purposes, or be exempted from TASP by their performance on the SAT, ACT or exit level TAAS. This data is for all students enrolling for the first-time at an institution during the academic year, including transfer students. The first row shows the number of students who receive academic exemptions from TASP based on SAT, ACT or exit level TAAS scores and the number who took the TASP test. The third row gives the percent of TASP takers who passed TASP on their initial attempt. The fourth row shows the percent of entering students who required remediation. (Exempted and TASP tested students, less students not passing TASP on their initial attempt.) This data is for the entire Academic Year 2000-2001.

FTE Teaching-Related Faculty, Fall 2001. Full-time-equivalent teaching-related faculty (FTE) as of Fall 2001. FTE faculty are faculty members reported with a salary greater than $\$ 0$ and assigned to:

1. direct instructional activities which include interaction with students related to instruction, preparation for such instruction and evaluation of student performance (category 01), and
2. administrative assignments, which directly supplement the teaching function (category 02).
"Other Faculty" includes faculty without tenure and not on tenure track including but not limited to adjunct, special, visiting, emeritus, and lecturers. It also may include faculty with tenure or on tenure track from another institution. Some other FTE faculty data reported by the CB includes only those faculty assigned to classes.

Total Teaching-Related Faculty Headcount. This row shows the number of faculty members by gender and ethnicity who are reported as faculty in the two categories shown in the preceding item. The following row shows the percentage of persons in each column who are employed less than $50 \%$ of a full-time workload.

Degrees Awarded in FY 2001. This data shows degrees awarded by gender, ethnicity and level and is based on certified graduation data provided by public institutions to the Coordinating Board.

Teacher Test Takers' Pass Rate for FY 2002. Not yet available. The State Board for Educator Certification administers the ExCET certification for prospective teachers. Candidates are eligible to take exams near the end of their preparation program; however, the university program must approve their registration for the exams. "Firstyear pass rate" reflects performance during the year the tests are initially taken; the "cumulative pass rate" is based on performance over the two-year period. Such an approach provides an incentive for programs to work with their students if they are not successful in passing on their first attempt. The first-year row shows student performance on ExCET tests taken initially during FY 2002. The cumulative row gives passing rates for tests taken in FY 2000 and in FY 2002 (i.e., from September 2000 to August 2002). The percentage by gender and ethnicity show the percentage of test takers in each category that passed the ExCET test.

Selected Current Fund Expenditures and Revenues. This financial summary is derived from each institution's audited Annual Financial Report for Fiscal Year 20001. It includes all funds, except auxiliary enterprise expenditures or revenues. "Other" expenditures include: public service, academic support, and student services. Grants, gifts, and contracts come from state, federal, private, and local sources. "Other" revenue sources include: Available University Fund, state remissions and exemptions, endowment or investment interest, sales and services, and other. HEAF funds are included in the state appropriation line.

Student full-time equivalents (FTE) are derived by dividing total semester credit hours (SCH) by level for Fall 2000, Spring 2001 and Summer 2001 by the following amounts: undergraduate by 30 SCH ; master's and special professional by 24 SCH ; and doctoral SCH by 18 .

## Notes:

Carnegie Classification. The Carnegie Classification of Higher Education groups American colleges and universities according to their missions. The Carnegie system aims to cluster institutions with similar programs and purposes. In August 2000 the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching adopted a new classification system. Carnegie classifies institutions primarily on the basis of the highest level of degree awarded. The definitions used for the revised classification are given below.

## Doctorate-granting institutions

Doctoral/Research Universities -- Extensive: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. They award 50 or more doctoral degrees per year across at least 15 disciplines.
Doctoral/Research Universities -- Intensive: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the doctorate. They award at least ten doctoral degrees per year across three or more disciplines, or at least 20 doctoral degrees per year overall.

## Master's (Comprehensive) Colleges and Universities

Master's (Comprehensive) Colleges and Universities I: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 40 or more master's degrees per year across three or more disciplines.
Master's (Comprehensive) Colleges and Universities II: These institutions typically offer a wide range of baccalaureate programs, and they are committed to graduate education through the master's degree. They award 20 or more master's degrees per year.

## Baccalaureate Colleges

Baccalaureate Colleges -- Liberal Arts: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. They award at least half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields. Baccalaureate Colleges -- General: These institutions are primarily undergraduate colleges with major emphasis on baccalaureate programs. They award less than half of their baccalaureate degrees in liberal arts fields.
