

CRIMINAL JUSTICE

The Criminal Justice field encompasses the agencies of social control including police, courts, corrections, and private agencies. The 33-hour Criminal Justice core provides students with a broad-based understanding of the field. The 15-hour elective block affords students the opportunity to tailor their degree to suit their career goals and interests.
