STRATEGIES FOR SUCCESS

- Don't put off classes. Students retain more Math at the beginning of their college career.
- Consider classes at other campuses. Refer to Student Advising Office transfer guides for class opportunities on other campuses.
- Be smart about scheduling. Take Math classes by themselves or during a summer session to focus more time and energy on the class.
- Visit the Counseling and Testing Center. Counselors can aid students in overcoming Math anxiety in order to succeed in Math classes. (Counseling & Testing Center, Union 321, 940-565-2741)
- ***** Utilize on-campus resources:
 - The <u>Learning Center</u> offers supplemental instruction, supplemental tutoring, and volunteer tutoring for lower level math classes (Learning Center, Union 323, 940-369-7006, www.unt.edu/lc)
 - The <u>Math Lab</u> offers help with homework problems and class preparation during regularly scheduled hours. Note the online schedule of tutors for the lab to identify the times when there will be tutors available who are familiar with your particular class. Assistance from lab tutors can also be accessed via the E-Math Lab for students who cannot be physically present in the GAB (Math Lab, GAB 440, 940-565-4045, www.math.unt.edu/mathlab)
 - The <u>Discovery Program</u> offers personalized tutoring and assistance for students who meet the requirements for being in the program. Speak with an advisor to determine your eligibility (Discovery Program, Highland Hall 201, 940-565-4754)
 - <u>Smarthinking.com</u> offers online tutoring 24/7 for a variety of different subject areas including math. This service can be accessed from any location via internet. Call the Learning Center at 940-369-7006 to get a username and password for the site.
- Commit yourself. Commit to doing "what it takes" to succeed in the class. Frustration is normal but don't lose sight of the greater goal, passing your class!
