The University of North Texas College of Information- Department of Library and Information Sciences will bring its ALA accredited Masters program and popular online format to the Virginias in partnership with the Library and Outreach Programs at James Madison University, Harrisonburg, Virginia.

Virginia Web Institute Dates: August 13- 16, 2010 and
January 6-9, 2011

The web institute portion of the Master's program includes an orientation, technology training, instruction in the core courses, as well as time to socialize with your colleagues and faculty.

UNT's Department of Library and Information Sciences will limit admission to a cohort of no more than forty students in the fall 2010 who will begin to study together for the Master's. Using a variety of communication tools, faculty and students will expand the learning community established during the on-site institutes to enable a high level of communication and support during the online portion of the program.
