Admission to Visual Arts Studies Major

Complete at least 60 hours of college courses (includes those listed below) and:

a. complete

- Art Appreciation (ART 1200), Design I (ART 1440), Design II (ART 1450), Drawing I (ART 1500), Drawing II (ART 1510), Art History Survey I (ART 2350), and Art History Survey II (ART 2360).
- as well as at least two of the required studio courses (ASTU 2200 [Beginning Figure Drawing], 2210 [Beginning Painting], 2300 [Intro to Printmaking], 2350 [Sculpture I], or 2417 [Beginning Watercolor]
- plus 1 of the following: ASTU 2050 [Ceramics], 2130 [Weaving], or 2150 [Metals & Jewelry I]),
- and AEAH 3753 with a grade of C or better.
- b. pass portfolio review while enrolled in AEAH3753;
- c. have at least a 2.75 GPA at UNT and overall;
- d. successful completion of all parts of Texas Higher Education Assessment (THEA or TASP) (successful completion means scoring 230 or better in Math, 220 or better in Writing, and 240 or better in Reading) or the appropriate score for certification on one of the following SAT, ACT, or TAAS.

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION POLICY FOR THE VISUAL ARTS STUDIES PROGRAM

For admittance into the Visual Arts Studies (VART) program, undergraduates are required to pass a selection process. Students must enroll in AEAH 3753: Foundations in Art Education. See program coordinator to sign up; seats in the course will be awarded based on completion of courses from the freshman and sophomore required classes (see over). During the semester, students enrolled in Foundations will need to apply for admission to the Visual Arts Studies program if they decide to pursue a B.F.A. in Visual Arts Studies.

In order to initiate the selection process, interested students must prepare and submit the following material:

- One Page artist statement that articulates your beliefs as an artist
- Unofficial UNT transcripts (must be obtained from the Registrar's Office)
- Portfolio of 10-12 color reproductions of personal artwork, printed onto a contact sheet
- Completed application form. Application forms will be distributed in AEAH 3753 or see program coordinator.
- One-page letter of intent addressing why you want to become an art teacher

All work must be presented in an envelope with the student's name, address, email, and telephone number marked clearly on the outside of the package. These application materials will not be returned to the student.

At the end of the semester, students will be notified by letter of their acceptance into the program. At that point, accepted students need to file a degree plan and they will be provided with codes for art education courses.

Visual Arts Studies courses must be completed in the following sequence:

- 1. When students are enrolled in AEAH 3753, they may apply for admission to the program. See **Admission to Visual Arts Studies Major** at the top of this page. Admission is not guaranteed. Once accepted into the program, official degree plan must be filed for Visual Arts Studies (VART).
- AEAH 4760 Global Examination of Aesthetics and AEAH 4795 Topics in Visual Arts Studies must be taken before AEAH 4780 Reflective Visual Arts
 Practices and AEAH 4790 Inquiry and Dialogue about Art. Prerequisites: ART 2350, 2360; AEAH 3753, 3770, 4750. Prior to registration, see the
 administrative assistant in the Department of Art Education and Art History (Art Building, Room 224) for restriction codes.
- 3. AEAH 4780 Reflective Visual Arts Practices must be taken concurrently with AEAH 4790 Inquiry & Dialogue about Art. Prerequisites: AEAH 3753, 3770, 4750, 4760, & 4795. See the administrative assistant in the Department of Art Education and Art History (Art Building, Room 224) for restriction codes.

IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY ONCE THEY HAVE BEEN OFFICIALLY ACCEPTED INTO THE VISUAL ARTS STUDIES PROGRAM TO MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BFA DEGREE IN VISUAL ARTS STUDIES AND FOR TEACHER CERTIFICATION:

- 1. Apply for Admission to Teacher Education (junior status, complete core courses with 2.75 UNT GPA and 2.75 overall GPA) after filing an official degree plan for Visual Arts Studies (VART). Information: Matthews Hall, Room 105.
- 2. Complete art courses and all professional development courses with grades of C or better.
- Apply for a degree plan after acceptance into the Visual Arts Studies program. Information: Art Building, Room 111.
- 4. Apply for Student Teaching. See Coordinator for Student Teaching and Field Observations for Art Education, Art Building, Room 224.
- 5. Students are highly encouraged to take the practice Professional Development/Education Exam before applying to take the state certification exams (TEXES).
- 6. Complete TEXES Tests (final assessments in art and professional development [education]). Information: Matthews Hall, Room 105.
- 7. Apply for Certification through the State Board of Educator Certification (SBEC) website: www.sbec.state.tx.us Information: Matthews Hall, Room 105.
