UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION POLICY FOR THE VISUAL ARTS STUDIES PROGRAM

For admittance into the Visual Arts Studies program, undergraduates are required to pass a selection process instituted by the Department of Art Education and Art History. Beginning in Fall 2008, under the new degree plan, any UNT student can enroll in *Art 3753: Foundations in Art Education*. By Nov. 1 in the fall semester and April 1 in the spring semester, students enrolled in Foundations will need to apply for admission to the Art Education program if they decide to pursue a B.F.A. in Visual Arts Studies.

In order to initiate the selection process, interested students must prepare and submit a number of artifacts that represent their experiences in the visual arts. All work must be presented in an envelope with the student's name, address, email, and telephone number marked clearly on the outside of the package. These application materials will **not** be returned to the student. Students will need to **attach <u>this</u> sheet to the outside of their packet** and submit the following to the Department of Art Education and Art History:
