# Supplemental Information for BFA with a Major in Visual Arts Studies

Visual Arts Studies courses must be completed in sequence:

1. ART 3850, Materials and Processes I, must be taken concurrently with ART 3855, Elementary Art Curriculum and Implementation. Prior to enrollment, student must pass all aspects of the TASP and complete core courses with a 2.75 GPA.

2. ART 3860, Materials and Processes II, must be taken concurrently with ART 3865, Secondary Art, Curriculum Development and Implementation. Prerequisite(s): ART 3850, 3855.

3. ART 4890, Criticism and Aesthetics.

Prerequisite(s): ART 3850, 3855, 3860, 3865. ART 4890 is the capstone course for Visual Arts Studies. It must be completed prior to student teaching; no special problems courses will be substituted. If the final review is unsatisfactory, the student will receive a grade of F or I and graduation will be delayed.

It is the student's responsibility after completion of 60 semester hours to meet the following requirements:

1. TASP.

2. Application for admission to Teacher Education (junior status, complete core courses with 2.75 UNT GPA, 2.75 overall GPA).

3. Application for degree plan after completion of 60 hours.

4. Application for student teaching.

5. Application for graduation.

6. ExCET test (final assessment in art and professional development [education]).

7. Application for certification.
