Instrumental Literature - Oboe Solo & Chamber Repertoire

Course Description -

This course presents an overview of the important solo and chamber repertoire for the oboe.

Course Objectives -

By the completion of this course, students are expected to:

- 1. Be familiar with the stylistic and technical issues posed by a wide range of solo and chamber works for oboe.
- 2. Be familiar with resources and techniques available for studying and mastering this literature.

Required reading -

The Oboe - Geoffrey Burgess & Bruce Haynes, Yale University Press (2010) Ornamentation – A Practical Guide, Charles Veazey, pages 20-21 https://oboe.music.unt.edu/sites/default/files/Veazey.Handbook.pdf Two or more sources for each of the works reviewed and summarized.

For each class all students will be prepared to make a 12 minute presentation describing briefly all the works on their composer list for the week, then focusing on three of their favored works by playing recorded examples from these works and describing the technical and stylistic challenges they present. Students will submit copies of a written summary of their presentation to the professor and other students in the class.

This summary will consist of at least one page describing the student's three favored works and one page summarizing the rest. All summaries must include the composers' dates, national origin, date of composition, stylistic description and any interesting facts about the work as space permits. At the end of the course, the student will have a binder of summaries to facilitate study for written and oral exams, and for future professional reference.
