NOTE: You cannot work as a teaching assistant or teaching fellow who teaches a lab class unless you have completed or are currently enrolled in ART 5700 (University Teaching Seminar in Art, which is only offered during the fall semester); or ADES 5534 (Design Pedagogy) and ADES 5536 (University Citizenship). If you have not taken or will not enroll in these options, do not apply to teach a lab class.

If you request and are assigned to teach a lab section of design, drawing or photography, you must also attend the lecture section for that lab. Please check the current schedule of classes to make sure that you do not schedule your personal classes during that lecture time. Design or drawing teaching assistants must also be available to attend weekly meetings in that area.

NOTE: If awarded an assistantship or fellowship, **your appointment will start the week PRIOR TO the beginning of the semester**. Typically, a general faculty/staff/TA meeting is held early on the Monday of that week before classes, which you will be required to attend, as well as other meetings throughout the week. Please check with the College of Visual Arts and Design for a schedule of that week's events, so that you may plan accordingly.

Do not apply if you cannot meet any of the following conditions:

- You must be a degree seeking graduate student majoring in an area of the College of Visual Arts and Design.
- You must attend any TA/TF/AA meetings that may be scheduled during the week prior to the beginning of the semester of your appointment.
- You must not have exceeded your limit of support (4 semesters for MA, 6 semesters for MFA and Ph.D.)
- If you accept a ½-time appointment for the fall or spring semester, you must enroll in 9 credit hours of coursework towards your
 degree during the semester of your appointment. If you accept a ¼-time appointment, you must enroll in 6 credit hours of
 coursework towards your degree (some exceptions made for those working on thesis, problem in-lieu-of thesis or dissertation).
- If you teach a design, drawing, or photography lab, you must attend the corresponding lecture section.
- If you teach design or drawing, you must attend weekly workshops with that area's coordinator.
- You must work locker duty (as managed by Mary Braden) for two hours during the first three weeks of classes.
