The Position

Lead tutors are model students who effectively facilitate a variety of tutoring services in the Learning Center, including one-on-one tutoring, walk-in tutoring, and online tutoring. Lead tutors also act as ambassadors for the Learning Center, facilitating a variety of workshops and presentations, visiting classes, and advertising the department's programs. When required, lead tutors also assist in the development and training of the Learning Center's volunteer tutors.

Requirements

- Possess a GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Working toward a degree in the College of Sciences
- Earned a grade of "A" in the courses in which a tutor facilitates
- Ability to communicate well through both oral and written forms of communication
- Knowledge of technical computer skills, with preferred knowledge in Microsoft Office
- Availability to attend the weekly LT meetings
- Availability to work 15 hours each week
- Availability to work primarily in the afternoons and evenings (4:00-8:00pm)
- *Tutoring experience is preferred*

- Scheduling and conducting tutoring sessions through our scheduling platforms
- Conducting walk-in and appointment-based tutoring sessions
- Monitoring and answering asynchronous student questions
- Developing and facilitating a science-based Course Foundations Workshop series
- Monitoring student interactions online
- Answering e-mail correspondence
- Assisting students in finding tutors
- Assisting with volunteer tutor training
- Tabling to advertise Learning Center programs and services
- Attend all training and meetings as directed by your supervisor
- Other duties as assigned by supervisor
