Degree Requirements & Information

- **Minimum Grades:** Grade of C or above in all required courses.
- **UNT GPA:** Minimum 2.000 GPA on all course work at UNT.
- GPA (All Courses): Minimum 2.000 GPA, UNT and transfer hours included (minimum 2.750 GPA for Admission to Teacher Education).
- **University Core GPA:** Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed University Core.
- Academic Major GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed Academic Major.
- Professional Development School (PDS) GPA: Minimum 2.750 GPA required in completed PDS, for all graded courses.
- **Total Hours:** Minimum of 120 total hours, at least 30 hours earned in residence at UNT. Completion of minimum hours required for the degree does not guarantee completion of all degree requirements.
- Best Choices: Specific courses recommended in some Core categories. Students may elect to take a different course listed under the University Core Curriculum to fulfill these requirements.
