Important Information About your Degree

- **“C” or Better:** Communication Core and all RESM courses must be completed with a grade of C or better in order to graduate.
- Courses in **bold** require pre-requisites. Pre-requisites are listed in the university catalog with the course description.
- Based on minor choice, electives may be required due to double-dipping.
- An official degree audit is required for graduation. Students **must** meet with an academic advisor to request a degree audit.
- Degree requires at least 120 hours, 2.00 UNT GPA, 2.00 overall GPA and 2.50 major GPA for graduation.
- 400 verified service hours in the Recreation/Event/Sport Management field must be completed within the 48 months preceding the internship, RESM 4100.
