The combined Bachelor of Science and Master of Science with a major in accounting is a 150-semester-hour program. Students awarded the Master of Science with a major in accounting are simultaneously awarded the Bachelor of Science with a major in accounting. (The Bachelor of Science with a major in accounting is not awarded separately.)

All entering College of Business students:

- Are classified as Business Undecided students. To be admitted to a BBA or BS program in the College of Business, students must meet "Admission to the Major" requirements on page two.
- Are responsible for integrating University Core and Pre-business courses into their schedule simultaneously for course sequencing and timely graduation purposes. See four-year plan on page three for scheduling suggestions.

Courses Recommended for Transfer

UNT Core: English Composition & Rhetoric

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or better is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

ENGL 2311 is required for the B.S./M.S. Accounting program and will fulfill both UNT core and major requirements.

UNT Core: Mathematics

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the College of Business pre-business requirements (see next column).

UNT Core: Social & Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling the College of Business pre-business requirements (see below).

UNT Core: Discovery

One course chosen from: ARTS 1301; BIOL/HECO 1322; GEOG 1303; HIST 2321 or 2322; PHIL 1301, 2303, or 2306; SPCH 1311 or 1315; TECA 1303

UNT Core: Capstone

The Capstone Core requirement is unique to UNT and will be fulfilled by an advanced course at UNT.

College of Business: Pre-Business Courses

- ACCT 2301 or 2401; and 2302 or 2402
- BCIS 1305 or 1405
- ECON 2301 and 2302 (fulfills both Social and Behavioral Sciences core and program requirements)
- MATH 1325 or 1425; or MATH 2313 or 2413 or 2513 (fulfills both Mathematics core and program requirements)
- *DSCI 2710 (offered at UNT only)*

A grade of 'C' or better is required in all pre-business requirements.

College of Business: Admission to the Major

In order to enroll in upper-division (3000-4000 level) business courses and declare a business major, the business undecided student must meet all the following requirements:

- Complete at least 45 hours of college level credit
- Complete the following pre-business prerequisite courses, with a grade of 'C' or higher:
 - ACCT 2301 or 2401
 - ACCT 2302 or 2402
 - BCIS 1305 or 1405
 - *DSCI 2710 (available at UNT only)*
 - ECON 2301
 - ECON 2302
 - ENGL 1301
 - ENGL 1302 or 2311
 - MATH 1325 or 1425; or MATH 2313 or 2413 or 2513
- Have at least a 2.7 cumulative UNT grade point average; or, for first term/transfer students, at least a 2.7 overall grade point average on all transfer coursework

Admission to the Graduate Portion: Admission to the graduate program is competitive, and completion of undergraduate course work does not guarantee admission to the graduate program. In addition to the departmental graduate admission requirements, a student must have a minimum overall program GPA of 2.8 and a minimum advanced accounting GPA of 3.0 in order to be admitted to the MS-Accounting program. The final decision regarding admission to the Master of Science with a major in accounting rests with the Department of Accounting.

Special Notes

Hours Required and General/College Requirements:

- Grade point average requirements for graduation with a BBA or BS from the College of Business:
 - a minimum of 2.7 grade point average in the professional and supporting field
 - a minimum of 2.7 grade point average in all courses completed at UNT
- A minimum of 150 semester hours (including a minimum of 114 undergraduate hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and 36 graduate credit hours), and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Business Administration or Bachelor of Science degree as specified in the "[General University Requirements](#)" section of the UNT catalog and the College of Business requirements.
- A candidate for the degree must complete 33 hours of business administration courses in residence, of which 15 hours must be in the professional field of study.
- The College of Business will not grant upper-division (3000-4000 level) degree credit for any transfer course taken at the lower division. Upper-division course work transferred from a regionally accredited four-year institution will be evaluated on an individual course basis to determine applicable degree credit.

UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:

UNT complies with the mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

Choice of Catalog: Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.

The College of Business is accredited by the AACSB International—The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.
