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The College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences expects students to have completed the Texas State recommended high school program and be ready to enroll in Language 2040 (TCCNS: Language 2311). If you are not prepared for this level, the necessary prerequisites will either replace electives or increase the hours required for this degree.

#### Courses Recommended for Transfer

The UNT Core requirements are shown with Texas Common Course Numbering System values only when UNT offers equivalent courses. There may be other courses in transfer that apply toward the specific degree requirement, but those listed are known to apply.

#### UNT Core: Communications

ENGL 1301; and ENGL 1302 or 2311

A grade of 'C' or better is required on courses applied toward this requirement.

#### UNT Core: Mathematics

This requirement will be met by fulfilling B.S. Economics major requirements (see next column).

#### UNT Core: Life & Physical Science

For students not majoring in Science, Mathematics, or Engineering, completing two courses from the list below is recommended (see an Academic Advisor for more options).

#### UNT Core: American History

Two courses chosen from: HIST 1301, 1302, 2301

#### UNT Core: Government/Political Science

GOVT 2305 and 2306

#### UNT Core: Creative Arts

One course chosen from: ARTS 1301 or 1304; DRAM 1310; MUSI 1306; SPCH 2341

#### UNT Core: Language, Philosophy and Culture

One course chosen from: ENGL 2332 or 2333; HIST 2321 or 2322; PHIL 1301, 1304, 2303, 2306, or 2316

#### UNT Core: Social & Behavioral Sciences

This requirement will be met by fulfilling B.S. Economics major requirements (see next column).

#### UNT Core: Component Area Option

This requirement may be met by fulfilling the Major and the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences requirement (see next column).

#### College of Liberal Arts & Social Sciences Core: Foreign Language

Students may complete either of two options to satisfy the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences foreign language requirement:

##### Option I:

Any foreign language 2311 and 2312.

Courses must be taken in the same language.

NOTE: Prerequisites for foreign language 2311 and 2312 courses are 1311 and 1312 or 1411 and 1412 or 1511 and 1512. Placement exams may be available; see your community college academic advisor for details

##### Option II:

6 hours of mathematics in addition to MATH 2313 or 2413 or 2513 and MATH 2314 or 2414.

Lower-level TCCNS Options:

MATH 2305 or 2405 (also fulfills Core Component Area Option)  
MATH 2315 or 2415  
MATH 2318 or 2418

UNT's MATH 3680 may be taken to fulfill the statistics requirement and will also count toward the additional 6 hours of mathematics.

#### B.S. Economics: Other Course Requirements

- ECON 2301 (Grade of 'B' or better required) (fulfills both Social & Behavioral Sciences core and major requirements)
- ECON 2302 (Grade of 'B' or better required) (fulfills both Component Area Option core and major requirements)
- MATH 2313 or 2413 or 2513 (Grade of 'C' or better required) (fulfills both Mathematics core and major requirements)
- MATH 2314 or 2414 (Grade of 'C' or better required)

*Courses listed above are TCCNS options and do not include all courses required for the UNT B.S. Economics major.*

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#### Special Notes

**Hours Required and General/College Requirements:** A minimum of 120 semester hours, of which 42 must be advanced, and fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Science degree as specified in the [General University Requirements](#) section of the UNT catalog and the College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences requirements

A student must earn at least a "B" in ECON 2301 and ECON 2302 and at least a "C" in all economics courses above the 3000 level. A student must earn at least a "B" in ECON 2302 before taking UNT's ECON 3550 and at least a "B" in ECON 2301 before taking UNT's ECON 3560. In all other cases, a student must earn a grade of "C" or higher in any prerequisite course before taking the next course in a sequence.

To graduate with a B.S. with a major in economics, a student must have a GPA of 2.5 in all economics courses (including transfer work). Students may retake UNT economics courses to improve the overall economics GPA. In computing the economics GPA, only the grade in the last repetition of a course will be included.

**UNT Core Curriculum/Transfer of Core Curriculum:** UNT complies with the [mandates of the 1997 Texas Legislature](#) regarding requirements for state-assisted institutions. Students who successfully complete the common core curriculum (in whole or in part) at a Texas state-assisted institution of higher education are eligible to transfer as "core complete" for those categories in the UNT University Core Curriculum.

Individual academic programs may require courses contained in parts of the University Core Curriculum. Students who wish to take courses that will fulfill both core and major/program requirements simultaneously should check with academic advisors for assistance in selecting core courses.

**Choice of Catalog:** Any student transferring directly from a Texas public community college to UNT shall have the same choice of catalog designating degree requirements as the student would have had if the dates of attendance at the university had been the same as the dates of attendance at the community college.
