The Bachelor of Arts in International Studies with a Concentration in International Business & Economics is an interdisciplinary major that introduces the student to the international business community. Students will take classes with an international flavor in Economics, Management, and Marketing. Students will also study a world region from either Asia, Latin America, Europe or Africa & the Middle East and take a language that matches that region. For example, Africa & the Middle East for the region and either Arabic or French for the language.

There are 42 hours in this major, 36 of which are advanced (3000 or 4000 level). Students will complete a total of 18 hours in their chosen language and 6 of those hours are advanced. Additionally there is a prerequisite course that must be taken that is also advanced, giving the student a total of 45 advanced hours. In many cases students are able to complete a minor in their chosen language by taking one more advanced course and earning grades of C or better in each class. There is also room in this plan to add a minor in Business Foundations should the student wish to add to their business acumen.

We encourage students to participate in Study Abroad programs when possible and especially to seek out and obtain internships. Several of our students have been lucky enough to do internships abroad and accomplish both simultaneously! Our alumni work in multiple related fields both nationally and internationally. They can be found in government, education, business, and the military. Students today will be global leaders tomorrow!
