When it opens in early 2019, this innovative, \$63 million facility that combines state-of-the-art learning and student life elements, will provide unprecedented opportunities to our

This July we are also welcoming a new leader, Dean Felecia Epps, to UNT Dallas College of Law. Dean Epps comes to us with an impressive resume and laser-like focus on helping our law school achieve full accreditation and improved bar passage rates. As Dean Epps comes aboard, Founding Dean Royal Furgeson moves into a fundraising role that will allow us to continue to take advantage of his strengths as an inspirational leader and great communicator.

Our leadership team is more determined than ever to build DFW's great urban university, and it takes world class leaders and facilities to make that vision a reality. Our focus remains providing a pathway to social mobility to students from the Dallas area, and a critical piece of making sure no students fall through the cracks is the Dallas County Promise.

As part of this game-changing program, UNT Dallas is working closely with DISD, DCCCD and our friends with the education-focused non-profit "Commit" to track 9,300+

seniors from 31 high schools in 7 school districts. Promise students get free community college tuition and a success coach beginning during their school senior year of high school and continue through college completion. Textbooks stipends are available for students with a 2.5 GPA or better who demonstrate financial need. Upon successful completion of an associate's degree, Promise students will receive a full-tuition transfer scholarship to UNT Dallas, and we are proud to have been the first 4-year university to support and help build this innovative pathway for area students.

It might be summertime, but these are hardly lazy days for our young university. The hard work our students, faculty and staff are putting in this season will benefit the ever-expanding UNT Dallas family for decades to come. Blaze your trail!

Student Group Earns Prestigious Award: The Society for Human Resource Management awarded a 2017-18 Superior Merit Award to the UNT Dallas SHRM student chapter for providing superior growth and development

opportunities to its student chapter members. Dr. Karen Shumway, Dean of the School Business said the award designates the UNT Dallas chapter as "one of the best in the world."

College of Law Student Appointed as Regent: We are proud to have UNT Dallas College of Law student Amanda Pajares representing the school on the University of North Texas System Board of Regents. She was appointed by Governor Greg Abbott. Pajares earned her Bachelor of Arts in communications from the University of Texas at Tyler, where she was a decorated, multi-sport athlete. Her term as student regent runs through May 31, 2019.
