**Courtyard Construction** – Demolition of the courtyard between Building I and Founders Hall is about to get underway, causing a slight re-routing for faculty, staff, students and visitors entering either building.

As part of Phase I of the construction project, the courtyard has been fenced off, diverting foot traffic between the buildings to the sidewalk fronting the parking lots likely through July 17.

Both Building I and Founders Hall will remain easily accessible by pathways created using the west sidewalk. Founders Hall access will be through the west entrance, while the north and south entrances of Building One will remain open.

**College of Law Hooding Ceremony** –More than 115 College of Law students were eligible to participate as UNT Dallas College of Law presented its second Hooding Ceremony May 19, 2018 at the historic Majestic Theatre, followed by a reception at the College of Law.
