
At UNT, any competitive scholarship of \$1,000 or more per academic year guarantees in-state tuition rates for the term of the award.

In the 2017-18 academic year: The College of Music awarded **\$1,163,044.00** in scholarships. ***

One-third of music students (525 out of 1565) received merit scholarships of \$1,000 or more from the College of Music. ***

Over one-third of graduate students (206 out of 564) received teaching assistantships or fellowships. In 2017-2018, all new full-time teaching assistantships and fellowships covered 3 hours of tuition and fees for master's students, and 6 hours of tuition and fees for doctoral students. These full-time assistantships and fellowships also included an employment waiver, allowing for non-Texas resident to pay in-state tuition. ***


In-state tuition and fees at UNT averaged \$7,165/year (9 hours per semester) for graduates.
