The Bachelors of Arts with a major in Spanish offers quality instruction that enables students (1) to understand, read, write, and speak the language they have chosen to study; (2) to gain, through the use of these language skills, a knowledge of the countries, regions, and peoples where that language is spoken; and (3) to develop an understanding of cultures and history of such regions. In addition, the Department provides training for teachers of world languages at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

In this major, you will complete up to 12 semester hours in beginning and intermediate Spanish and an additional 27 semester hours in advanced Spanish coursework.
