Boiler Law HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE, CHAPTER 755 Effective 9/1/2003

SUBCHAPTER B. BOARD OF BOILER RULES § 755.011. COMPOSITION OF BOARD.

(a) The Board of Boiler Rules is in the department.

- (b) The board is composed of the following nine members appointed by the presiding officer of the commission, with the commission's approval:
 - (1) three members representing persons who own or use boilers in this state;
 - (2) three members representing companies that insure boilers in this state;
 - (3) one member representing boiler manufacturers or installers;
 - (4) one member representing organizations that repair or alter boilers in this state; and
 - (5) one member representing a labor union.
- (c) A member must have experience with boilers. To the extent possible, at least four members should be professional engineers registered in this state.
- (d) The executive director serves as an ex officio board member.
- § 755.012. TERMS. Board members serve for staggered six-year terms, with the terms of three members expiring January 31 of each odd-numbered year.
- § 755.013. PRESIDING OFFICER. The chief inspector serves as presiding officer of the board.

§ 755.014. REMOVAL OF BOARD MEMBERS; VACANCY.

- (a) The commission may remove a board member for inefficiency or neglect of official duty.
- (b) A board member's office becomes vacant on the resignation, death, suspension, or incapacity of the member. The presiding officer of the commission shall appoint, in the same manner as the original appointment, a person to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.
- § 755.015. COMPENSATION. A board member may not receive a salary but is entitled to reimbursement for actual expenses incurred in performing board duties.
- § 755.016. MEETINGS. The board shall meet at least twice each year at the call of the presiding officer at a place designated by the board.
- § 755.017. POWERS AND DUTIES. The board shall advise the commission in the adoption of definitions and rules relating to the safe construction, installation, inspection, operating limits, alteration, and repair of boilers and their appurtenances.
- § 755.018. MAJORITY VOTE REQUIRED. A board decision is not effective unless supported by the vote of at least five board members.
