



Agricultural Waste Pesticide Collections

Amounts Collected From 1992–2006

Organized by the Texas Cooperative Extension, Texas Department of Agriculture, and the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, these free collections give agricultural producers who use pesticides in Texas an opportunity to dispose of unwanted or unused (waste) pesticides and products that may pose a hazard to them, their families, and their surrounding farming and ranching communities.
