FIREARM/HUNTING SAFETY

Shooting Safety Rules

1. Always point the muzzle or nocked arrow in a safe direction.
2. Treat every firearm or bow with the same respect you would show a loaded gun or nocked arrow.
3. Be sure of your target – what is in front of and beyond your target.
4. Unload firearms and unstring conventional bows when not in use.
5. Handle firearms, arrows and ammunition carefully.
6. Know your safe zone-of-fire and stick to it.
7. Control your emotions when it comes to safety.
8. Wear hearing and eye protection.
9. Don't drink alcohol or take drugs before or while handling firearms or bow and arrows.
10. Be aware of additional circumstances which require added caution or safety awareness.

HUNTER EDUCATION

Every hunter (including out-of-state hunters) born on or after Sept. 2, 1971, must successfully complete a Hunter Education Training Course. Minimum age of certification is 12 years and cost is \$15.

If you were born on or after Sept. 2, 1971, and you are:

- under 12 years of age, you must be accompanied*.
- age 12 through 16, you must successfully complete a hunter education course, or you must be accompanied*.
- age 17 and over, you must successfully complete a hunter education course; or purchase a "Hunter Education Deferral," and you must be accompanied*.

New - Hunter Education Deferral (cost: \$10)

Allows a person 17 years of age or older who has not completed a hunter education program to defer completion for up to one year. A deferral may only be obtained once and is only valid until the end of the current license year. A person who has been convicted or has received deferred adjudication for violation of the mandatory hunter education requirement is prohibited from applying for a deferral. Take the course by August 31 of the current license year and receive a \$5 discount.

*Accompanied means: By a person who is at least 17, who is licensed to hunt in Texas, who has passed hunter education or is exempt (born before Sept. 2, 1971), and you must be within normal voice control. Proof of certification or deferral is required to be on your person while hunting. Note: Certification is not required to purchase a hunting license.

Bowhunter Education - Certification is required on certain areas of Texas (Hagerman National Wildlife Refuge, Pottsboro and Camp Bullis, San Antonio). Note: Bowhunter education does not substitute for Hunter Education certification.

- **Hunting licenses and stamps** Valid September 1 or the date issued through August 31. Temporary hunting licenses-limited time frames.

TEXAS HUNTING REGULATIONS– See Texas Parks and Wildlife Department "Outdoor Annual" available each year around August 1st for hunting regulations beginning September 1st.

Texas Migratory Hunting Regulations – Dove and Teal Hunting Regulations are contained within the "Outdoor Annual."

Duck, merganser, coot, goose, sandhill crane, woodcock and snipe hunting dates and bag limits are not in the "Outdoor Annual," but they are made available in October of each year.

- HIP certification is required of all migratory game bird hunters nationwide.

HUNTER ORANGE – Hunters on public land must visibly wear at least 400 square inches of hunter orange material with orange headwear and at least 144 square inches appearing on both chest and back during daylight hours at times when hunting with firearms is permitted. For more information and exemptions, call (512) 389-4505.

OPERATION GAME THIEF – If you know a poacher or know of poaching activity, report these violations to Operation Game Thief by calling (800) 792-GAME and help preserve our wildlife resources. Information leading to the arrest and conviction of a poacher may result in a cash reward up to \$1,000.
