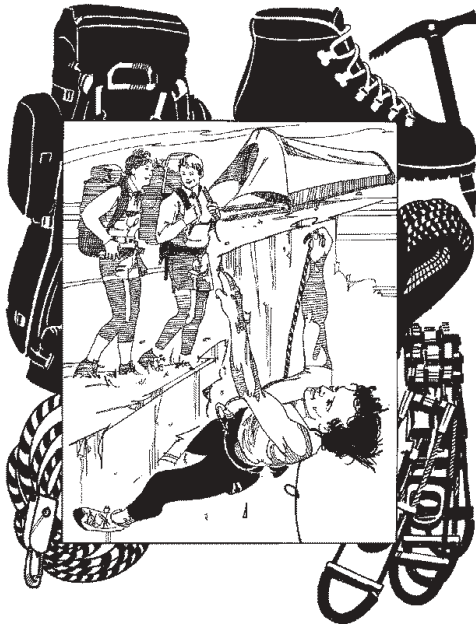

LAKE MINERAL WELLS STATE PARK:

Lake Mineral Wells State Park and Trailway is located 4 miles east of Mineral Wells on U.S. Highway 180 or 14 miles west of Weatherford on U.S. Highway 180. (940) 328-1171

Where to go

ENCHANTED ROCK STATE NATURAL AREA:

The park is 18 miles north of Fredericksburg on Ranch Road 965, or from Llano, take State Highway 16 for 14 miles south and then go west on Ranch Road 965. (325) 247-3903

HUECO TANKS STATE HISTORIC SITE:

The park can be reached by traveling 32 miles northeast of El Paso just off U.S. Highway 62/180, then turning north on Ranch Road 2775. (915) 857-1135
