- · Public consumption or display of an open container of alcoholic beverage is prohibited. All outdoor areas within the park are "public."
- . Pets must be on a leash no longer than six feet and must not be left unattended. This keeps them and others safe while protecting
- · Leave all plants, animals, minerals and artifacts in the park as you found them. Everything in the park is protected by State Law for everyone's enjoyment.
- . Persons under 18 years old are not permitted to ride in the back of a pickup truck or on a trailer.
- . Stay on designated trails. It is harder to spot poisonous wildlife and plants off trail. Creating or using unauthorized trails causes confusion, destroys vegetation and increases soil erosion.
- Numbered sites are for overnight camping only. NO PICNICKING.

- tent at primitive campsites and no tents or RVs are permitted at screened shelters.
- · Quiet hours are enforced from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Guests who do not have a camping (overnight) permit MUST leave the park by 10 p.m. Unnecessary noise can ruin your neighbor's outdoor experience.
- Gathering firewood is prohibited. Dead wood is an important source of food and shelter to wildlife and it helps to replenish nutrients in the soil.
- Black water and gray water can only be discharged at the dump station. This water carries bacteria that can spread serious illness and food particles that can attract undesirable animals, including fire ants.
- Park all vehicles on the paved parking surface. Vehicles driven off the edge of the pavement damages the paved surface, destroys fragile vegetation and causes soil compaction and erosion. Excess vehicles MUST park in the overflow parking areas in front of the rest rooms or in the day use parking areas.
