OIEC CAN HELP YOU

OIEC was created to help injured employees and is here to:

ASSIST

 OIEC can provide an Ombudsman once a proceeding has been scheduled to assist the unrepresented injured employee throughout the dispute process.

EDUCATE

- OIEC can answer questions that injured employees have regarding the workers' compensation system.
- OIEC can provide referrals to other local, state and federal agencies, including the Department of Assistive & Rehabilitative Services (DARS), as appropriate.
- If injured employees have complaints regarding health care providers, OIEC can assist in referring those complaints to the appropriate entities and licensing boards.

ADVOCATE

- OIEC will identify issues affecting injured employees and address those issues in the legislative and rulemaking processes and through the simplification of procedures and forms.
- OIEC will also monitor the performance of the workers' compensation system, with a focus on return to work of injured employees.

WHAT IS AN OMBUDSMAN?

An **Ombudsman** is an employee of OIEC who can assist you if you have a dispute with your employer's insurance carrier. An Ombudsman's assistance is free of charge. Each Ombudsman has a workers' compensation adjuster's license and has completed a comprehensive training program designed specifically to assist you with your dispute.

If you have a proceeding scheduled before the Texas Department of Insurance, Division of Workers' Compensation, an Ombudsman can:

- Help you prepare for the proceeding (Benefit Review Conference and/or Contested Case Hearing);
- Attend the proceeding with you and communicate on your behalf; and
- Assist you with your appeal and answer insurance carrier appeals.

Ombudsman assistance is provided to unrepresented injured employees free of charge.
