Date: 10.19.06 Page 2 of 4 contracts submitted in exhibit 4 need to comply with both sections 10.41 and 10.42 of the Texas Administrative Code. When I tell someone that and they go back and look those two sections, they say 'this has nothing to do with third party contracts.' One is network carrier contract provisions and the other is provider contract provisions. However, the Code does require that any third party contract comply with both of those sections. That is in 1305.154(c)(10) if you want to look it up. The other issue with third party contracts is they need to be executed when they are submitted. We will not review them if they are not executed. Any questions on third party contracts, or any other issue? Are you finding that these calls are continuing to be helpful? **A:** I think they are. Even if I don't have questions, it is helpful to hear other people's questions. If there are no other questions, this will be a very short call. I would like to see some suggestions or concerns that you are having sent to WCNet@tdi.state.tx.us that we can add to these calls. If you have a question submitted to WCN, we can get that information out to everyone.
