

BIRDING ETHICS

- Stay on established pathways and keep motor vehicles on established roads and parking areas.
- Avoid barassment; don't disturb birds that are nesting or their nesting areas. Do not bandle eggs or young, or tarry too long at a working nest.
- Don't over-use audio playback tapes or owl tapes to call birds in.
- Don't trespass on private property. Respect landowners' rights to privacy. Always ask permission first.
- Follow all USFWS refuge and state land rules and regulations.
- Divide larger groups of people into smaller, more manageable numbers when leading a tour. Small groups cause less disturbance. When possible, carpool.
- Leave no litter or trash. Pack your garbage out. Ingested trash items can kill animals.
- Support Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's Nongame Fund. A good portion of the money donated goes towards management of nongame birds and their babitat.
- Order a conservation license plate.
