

Finding Treatment for Breast or Cervical Cancer



I've been diagnosed, who can help?

Help is available. Medicaid for Breast and Cervical Cancer (MBCC) is a program that provides access to cancer treatment for eligible women.

Am I eligible for Medicaid for Breast and Cervical Cancer?

In order to qualify for MBCC, a woman must be:

- o Diagnosed and in need of treatment for breast or cervical cancer; and
- Low-income (at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines).

- o Uninsured; and
- o Under age 65; and
- o Texas resident; and
- o A U.S. citizen or qualified alien

If you think you are eligible you must go to a Breast and Cervical Cancer Services (BCCS) clinic to apply. If you are not sure if you qualify, please contact a clinic near you for help.

Where do I go to apply for MBCC?

NOTE: The local Medicaid offices **CANNOT** complete the application.

Do I need an appointment? What do I bring?

- 1. First, call the BCCS clinic to setup an appointment.
- 2. Ask what eligibility information is needed to apply.
- 3. Make sure you have the required documents before the appointment date.

^{*} To speed up the application process, call your doctor and tell him/her that you are applying for Medicaid for Breast and Cervical Cancer and may need supporting documents for the application.
