



New Heirloom Birth and Wedding Anniversary Certificates

Register for the 2007 Texas Vital Statistics Regional Conferences (See inside for details)

Texas Vital Statistics announces the availability of new heirloom birth and wedding anniversary certificates!

The heirloom birth certificates measure 11" x 14" and feature a specially designed engraved intaglio border with engraved seals on heirloom quality paper that incorporates security features. Two background designs are available: baby bassinet and Texas state flag. These legal certificates have the appearance of parchment and bear the signatures of the Governor of the State of Texas and the Texas State Registrar with a cost of \$60 per certificate. These certificates may only be issued to the individual or immediate family members. Therefore, a special gift certificate is available that can be ordered and redeemed by a person qualified to receive the birth certificate. These certificates may not be issued to persons whose births were established by court order or delayed record procedures.

The heirloom wedding anniversary certificate measures 11" x 14" and features a parchment-like appearance that may be customized to recognize a couple's wedding anniversary. This commemorative certificate bears the signatures of the Governor of the State of Texas and the Texas State Registrar with a cost of \$60 per certificate. The certificate may be purchased by anyone including the couple, their children, grandchildren, other relatives, or friends. This is not a legal certificate. It does not establish and may not be used to establish a marriage relationship.

Delayed Birth Records

Question: What should you do if a customer indicates that they do not have a birth record on file?

Answer: A formal, paid (\$22) search must be conducted at the State Vital Statistics Unit to determine that the birth record is not on file. The \$22 searching fee is non-refundable. This search is required even if a prior search has been conducted at the local registration office where the birth occurred.

If the birth record is not located, the customer will receive a packet that contains forms and instructions for filing a Delayed Certificate of Birth (VS-122). Next, the customer submits the completed Delayed Certificate of Birth form, supporting documentation and filing fee back to the State Vital Statistics Unit. The cost for filing a Delayed Certificate of Birth is \$25 and each certified copy is \$22. If the completed Delayed Certificate of Birth form has been approved and the supporting documentation has

been verified, the Delayed Certificate of Birth will become the customer's original birth certificate. Processing time is determined by the acceptability and verification of the supporting documentation submitted by the customer.

If you have any existing forms used to register a Delayed Certificate of Birth, please destroy them unless they are the forms used by county judges to file a Court Ordered Delayed Certificate of Birth.
