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## Online Ordering of Birth & Death Certificates Now Available

Texas birth and death certificates, as well as birth, death, marriage and divorce verifications, can now be ordered online from the State Office. Previously, certificates could only be requested by mail, fax, or by visiting Texas Vital Statistics in Austin or the local registrar office where the event occurred.

Texas Vital Statistics received frequent inquiries about the availability of an online ordering option, and customers made it clear that this was needed. By creating this option via the Internet, secure ordering of vital documents is only a few mouse clicks away for customers.

These records may be ordered online at the official eGovernment Website for the State of Texas: <u>www.texasonline.com</u>. Visitors to the Texas Vital Statistics site at <u>www.dshs.state.tx.us/vs</u> are greeted by the TexasOnline logo and an invitation to order records online. The process is easy, and one that customers have embraced. Since inception of this option, over 15,500 records have been ordered. Ordering vital records online is

### Local Registrar Reminder

The end of a calendar year brings special requirements for local registrars. Please make sure you have done the following: 1. Verify with source providers that all 2005 events have been filed. 2. Remember to continue numbering 2005 records with the 2005 number series. 3. Mail all 2005 records to the State Office as soon as possible. easy but there are some restrictions. Records cannot be downloaded or printed. Online ordering of a birth certificate for a birth that occurred in the last 75 years is limited to the individual for whom the record is requested and to the mother and father of that individual. Ordering of a death certificate for deaths that occurred within the last 25 years is limited to the surviving spouse, parent of the deceased and funeral director of record.

Fees for certificates and verifications are the same as charged by the state office for walk-in and mail-in requests, and are paid with credit cards.

### Social Security & the Marriage Certificate

County clerks have reported that some female customers are having problems in using the marriage certificate to change their surname with the Social Security Administration (SSA). According to the SSA, if the marriage certificate does not have biographical data, then additional documents are required. Acceptable identity documents would show the person's name AND provide:

1. **biographical information** in addition to the person's name that can be compared with the data on the application (e.g., date of birth, age or parents' names) and/or

2. **physical information** that can be compared with the application (e.g., physical description or photograph).

### **TER-Death** Update

The launch of the Texas Electronic Registrar (TER)-Death system is progressing. Initial pilot areas have been trained, and real-world testing and improvement of the TER-Death system for complete registration is proceeding methodically. It is critically important for the success of electronic death registration in Texas that the system be easy to use and as bug-free as possible for all potential users. The plan is to open TER-Death to all users in April, 2006.

At the same time that the pilot sites are testing the system, select local registrars statewide are using TER-Death to verify Social Security numbers and to create local indexes of 2006 deaths.

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## Changes in Death Registration

Since implementation of the new Certificate of Death in January, 2006, there have been numerous inquiries about the new document and how to handle the distinctions between the prior document and the current Certificate of Death (VS-112 REV 1/2006).

To understand the changes made to the Certificate of Death, you must first understand that the changes are made in accordance with the U.S. standard model death certificate advocated by the National Center for Health Statistics of the Center for Disease Control. The changes are based on federal guidlelines.

One item that is causing confusion is item #29, "License Number." This item requires the Texas medical license number of the physician certifying the death. Since justices of the peace do not have medical license numbers, a certifying JP should leave this item blank. Similarly, active duty physicians in the military on bases and at Veterans Hospitals may not have Texas medical license numbers. These particular physicians should leave item #29 blank.

Another source of confusion with the new death record is not related to an addition but rather to an

omission. The new Certificate of Death does not have "Date of Disposition" as an item. In revising the Certificate of Death, it became apparent that "Date of Disposition" is not required by statute nor is it on the U.S. standard model death certificate. "Date of Disposition" was a common item of error on the old death certificate, with it preceding the date of death in many cases. This resulted in death certificates being rejected or requiring amendment. Even though it is an adjustment, it is felt that there are advantages to excluding this on the new form. Another change in the death

registration process is of special interest to funeral directors and their staff. According to information received from the Social Security Administration (SSA), funeral directors using the TER-Death system will no longer need to submit to SSA a separate SSA-721 as Social Security verification is built into TER-Death and will streamline this process. SSA does ask that funeral directors using TER-Death distribute the last two pages of the SSA-721 to families to inform them about benefits and the application process. Those funeral homes not on TER-Death will continue to submit the SSA-721on each death.

## **TER-Death Training Opportunities**

Effective immediately, all <u>manual</u> Acknowledgments of Paternity (AOPs) MUST be completed on the VS 159.1M (revised 9/2005). As instructed by OAG Attorney, Kathy Shafer, Texas Vital Statistics will no longer accept older versions of the AOP in the AOP Registry. The only exception will be if the older form was signed PRIOR TO 2/28/ 06. Please destroy any older forms and use only the newest version.
