Curbside recycling is now available with your Trash Service. Recycling tubs are available upon request. Items to place in your recycling tub at the curb include: Cardboard, paper, newspaper, magazines, plastic, aluminum, and tin cans. Please rinse out plastic, aluminum and tin cans and on rainy days cover your tub or remove paper items. Wet paper cannot be recycled.

Trash Services

Curbside service is provided with your water account. In addition to your trash bin, you may put bundled trash, boxes, bags, or anything that will fit in the truck, at the curb for pick up on your scheduled day. This does not include hazardous waste products.
