



### Premature Baby: What You CAN Say

- Open-Ended Questions
  - How do you feel?
  - What does your doctor tell you?
- Affirming Statements
  - I'm so sorry
  - It must be hard
- Education
  - Talking with other mothers who have had a premature baby
  - How to deal with any milk that comes in
  - Contact numbers for local support groups

### How Does Premature Birth Affect Breastfeeding?

- Gestational age of baby
- Condition of the baby
- Mother's health
- Support and information available to her



# Human Milk Is Especially Designed for the Premature Baby's Digestive System

When a Mother Pumps for Her Baby



### What are the Advantages to the Premature Baby?

- Protects from infection
- Protects against Necrotizing Enterocolitis (NEC)
- Immunologic protection
- Growth factors
- Visual development



#### What Are the Advantages for the Mother?

- Only the baby's mother can provide the best human milk for him/her
- Creates a physical closeness for her and her baby
- Allows the mom to be involved with her baby's care
- Allows mom's body to finish it's natural biological function



### A Premie Needs His Mother – Part 1



#### Problems With Pumping: How Often Should the Mother Pump?

- Pump within first 6 hours after birth, if possible
- Pump 8+ times during a 24 hour period
- Schedule pumping sessions for the same time baby feeds in NICU
- One expression session should be in late evening and in early morning
- Pump at least 100 minutes per day, double pumping preferred



#### Handling Human Milk



- Store in refrigerator or freezer after expressing
  - Label with baby's name and date
- Freeze in small quantities
  - 2-4 ounces usually
  - 1 ounce for premature babies
- Store in hard plastic containers or milk storage bags
- Keep milk cool when transporting



#### Stay Within Your Scope of Practice

- Remain close to the basic information with which you have been trained
- Provide information and support based on the evidence presented at your training
- For situations outside the basics, yield to your WIC designated breastfeeding expert



### Suggestions for Working With Her Health Professionals

- Encourage the mother to:
  - Write down her concerns
  - Find out when the baby's doctor will be in the NICU
  - Communicate her desire to breastfeed
  - Share breastfeeding information



### Suggestions for Working With Her Health Professionals

- Talk to the doctors and nurses taking care of the baby in the NICU
  - Be respectful
  - Polite
  - Helpful
  - Honest about concerns
  - Assertive, but tactful



Remember that all of you share the same goal – doing the best you can for the baby!



### What can a mother do to get to know her premature baby?

- Visit the baby often
- Skin-to-Skin Contact (Kangaroo Care)
- Touch, talk, and sing to baby









#### Remember!

Baby has heard mother's voice and been with mother inside the womb; he needs the emotional and physical comfort from mom to grow



#### What Is Kangaroo Care?

- Touching baby as much as possible
- Holding baby skin-to-skin (on mom or dad's chest)
- Breastfeeding



### What Are the Benefits of Kangaroo Care?

- Baby breathes better
- Baby has a steadier heart beat
- Baby's body stays warmer
- Baby sleeps better
- It is a step towards breastfeeding



#### When to Contact Mothers

- Frequent calls, every day or two, to check on the mother and baby
- Call within 24 hours if mother is having problems, and seek help from your designated WIC breastfeeding expert
- Follow the mother's cues for how often to call
- Remember mothers value someone checking on them



#### When to Contact Mothers

- Reinforce and support the healthcare team
- Be sensitive to mothers in difficult situations
  - Ask mom when her most convenient time is to talk
  - Respect needs of the mother and her family members
  - Be sensitive to their need for privacy, quiet, and time
  - Follow guidelines of your local WIC agency
  - Honor her wishes for no contacts if necessary



#### When to Contact Mothers

- Ideal contact times, when possible
  - Mothers of preterm infants weekly or biweekly
  - Sick babies daily or every few days as mother desires
  - Sick mothers every few days as mother feels able and desires



### Opening the Conversation With Mothers

- What are some of your feelings about being separated from baby?
- Who is around to help you?
- What is your family saying about breastfeeding?
- What are the doctors/nurses saying?



#### What if her baby dies?

- Empathetic ear
- Grief Counseling
- WIC until six months postpartum
- Donor milk banks



### Empty Arms – When a Baby is Lost

- What NOT to say
  - "It's for the best"
  - "Be thankful for your other children"
  - "I know how you feel"
  - "Let me tell you MY story"
  - "You are young, you can have other children"



#### Donating Milk

- Many mother's find donating to be a beneficial component of their grief process
- Enjoy contributing to the life of other babies



#### Donating Milk

- 1) a ~10-minute phone interview
- 2) a completed written health history
- 3) a blood test to screen for HIV, HTLV, Hep
   B & C, and syphilis
- The mother must have at least 100 oz (or 200 oz if shipping is needed b/c she's not in a collection area-Austin, San Antonio, New Braunfels, Houston, Plano) of milk to donate
