## **NEW PROCEDURES FOR LICENSE APPLICATIONS**

Effective November 1, 2007

In order to comply with recent immigration legislation (HB 1804), the Oklahoma Department of Labor has established the following new procedures for license applicants.

- A. In order to obtain a license, the requested documentation, including a signed Affidavit of Citizenship is required. In the absence of the required documentation, citizenship and immigration status cannot be determined and applicants may not be eligible for the license for which they are applying.
- B. Presentation of the following documents, <u>in person</u>, will be required to assist in establishing eligibility for a particular license and lawful presence to work in the United States:

#### **ALL OKLAHOMA RESIDENTS:**

- a. a valid, unexpired **Oklahoma Driver's License**; OR **Photo-Identification Card** from the Oklahoma Department of Public Safety; **AND**
- b. Social Security Card.

#### **ALL NON-RESIDENTS OF OKLAHOMA:** (Residents of another U.S. state):

- a. A valid, unexpired **Driver's License** OR **Photo-Identification Card** from your state of residency; **AND**
- b. **Birth Certificate**; OR

Social Security Card; OR

a valid, unexpired Passport; OR

a W-2 form from current employer.

#### **AFFIDAVIT OF or REGARDING CITIZENSHIP:** (All applicants must sign)

- a. If you are a U.S. Citizen, please provide the above requested documentation.
- b. If you are not a U.S. Citizen, but are a qualified alien under the federal Immigration and Nationality Act and are lawfully present in the U.S. to work, please provide one of the following documents listed in Section D.
- C. The Oklahoma Department of Labor participates in the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) Program, which is an intergovernmental information-sharing initiative designed to aid in determining a non-citizen applicant's immigration status (lawful presence), and thereby ensuring only eligible non-citizens receive government benefits, such as licenses.

The Oklahoma Department of Labor shall only issue licenses to Qualified Aliens (non-U.S.

## E. Complying with the above requirements does not guarantee issuance of a license. Applicants must still satisfy all other required qualifications of the respective licenses for which they are applying.

#### F. RENEWALS:

Effective November 1, 2007, all applicants will be required to present, in person, documentation listed in Sections B and D to establish eligibility. Once eligibility has been established, all renewal licenses can be approved each year, excluding the fifth year and every fifth year thereafter, by mailing an application, fee, and photocopy of the requested documentation listed in Sections B and D to the Oklahoma Department of Labor. If an applicant produces different documents for renewal than were produced to establish eligibility, the applicant must sign a new Affidavit of Citizenship or Affidavit Regarding Citizenship before a renewal license can be approved.

#### **OPTIONAL:**

ODOL approved industry training facilities will also be participating in the new licensing procedures. Training facilities will be available to their respective industry licensing holders in Oklahoma City and Tulsa. Applicants will still be required to be present in person at the training facility. Applicants will be photographed and asked to submit documentation listed in Sections B and D. The training facility will then certify the information and submit via email to ODOL. Applicants will still be responsible for submitting an application, affidavit of citizenship, along with required licensing fees to ODOL. Applications will then be reviewed by ODOL and mailed to approved license holders. For a list of approved training facilities, please contact ODOL at 405-528-1500 ext. 242 or 239.
